## KNIFE RIVER INDIAN VILLAGES NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE

NORTH DAKOTA

Knife River Indian Villages National Historic Site is the home of Sakakawea who accompanied Lewis and Clark on their expedition to the Pacific Ocean and return. The expedition wintered near the Knife River Villages in 1804-05, returning August 1806.

The park contains remnants of historic and prehistoric American Indian villages, last occupied in 1845 by the Hidatsa and Mandan tribes. Facilities/services include a visitor center, furnished earthlodge (summer months only), self-guided tours, and hiling trails.

## SPECIAL INFORMATION

The park is open daily from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Mountain Time, Memorial Day through Labor Day; 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. the rest of the year. Closed Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day.
