

KOREAN WAR VETERANS





Set in the Ash Woods in the shadow of the Lincoln Memorial, the Korean War Veterans Memorial hauntingly evokes the legions who served in the rugged terrain of Korea from 1950 to 1953. Along the pathway to the memorial are the names of the countries who fought alongside the American troops during the Korean War. Nineteen larger-than-life stainless steel troopers clad in foul-weather ponchos and full battle gear appear to march from the protection of the woods into battle. Dedicated July 29, 1995, this memorial reminds visitors: Freedom Is Not Free!
