## LAKE ROOSEVELT NATIONAL RECREATION AREA

WASHINGTON

In 1941, damming of the Columbia River as part of the Columbia River Basin project created a 150-mile long lake. Named for President Franklin D. Roosevelt, the lake is now the largest recreation feature in the Lake Roosevelt National Recreation Area. The 100,390-acre recreation area provides opportunities for boating, fishing, swimming, camping, hiking and tours of Fort Spokane. Lake Roosevelt National Recreation Area is part of the Columbia Cascades Cluster.

### **SPECIAL INFORMATION**

The recreation season is May through October. Camping reservations are accepted for group campsites only. Thirty-eight campgrounds are located within the Recreation Area with ranger-led programs at Kettle Falls, Evans, Fort Spokane, Spring Canyon, Keller Ferry, and Porcupine Bay. Fees charged at campgrounds and boat launch ramps. State license for fishing and hunting required.
