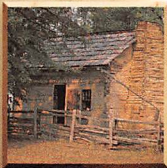

On this southern Indiana farm, Abraham Lincoln spent fourteen of the most formative years of his life and grew from youth into manhood. His mother, Nancy Hanks Lincoln, is buried here.

The Memorial Visitor Center features a museum and two memorial halls; the Abraham Lincoln Hall and the Nancy Hanks Lincoln Hall. Exhibits focus on the story of the Lincolns as pioneers in the Indiana wilderness.

SPECIAL INFORMATION

There are three established trails in the park: The Lincoln Boyhood Trail connecting the Memorial Visitor Center and the Lincoln Living Historical Farm; the Trail of Twelve Stones beginning at the Living Historical Farm and ending near the grave site; and the Lincoln Boyhood Nature Trail, a circular trail approximately one mile in length, which winds through a natural re-forested area. • Superintendent, Lincoln Boyhood Home National Memorial, P.O.
