In 1838, the United States government forcibly removed 15,000 Cherokee from their southern homelands and sent them to Indian Territory in present-day Oklahoma.

These sites provide a window into the Cherokee homeland and the early stages of Indian Removal. Visit the camps that held the Cherokee and follow their routes over land and water. Witness their experience and recognize Cherokee resilience.
