# Activities Schedule

### Guided Programs

Day & Time	Program	Description
Monday and Tuesday 8:30 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.	<b>Reef Bay Hike</b>	Take a guided hike down Reef Bay Trail. Discover 3,000 years of human history as you explore St. John's varied ecology. Please wear trail appropriate closed toe footwear and bring plenty of water and a light lunch or snack. This program requires advance sign-up and a fee of \$75 per participant to cover the cost of the taxi from Cruz Bay to the trailhead and the boat ride from Genti Bay back to Cruz Bay.
Wednesday 8:15 P.M.—9:15 P.M.	<b>Astronomy in the Park</b>	Explore the dark sky above St. John with a Park Ranger. Ranger Mark will provide a sky tour and use a telescope to reveal distant objects. Please bring a flashlight for the short hike to the west side of Cinnamon Bay Beach. A towel or chair may make sky viewing more comfortable.
Friday 7:30 A.M.—9:00 A.M.	<b>Feathers of Francis Bay</b>	Join us for a bird-watching walk on the Francis Bay Trail. This is one of the best areas on St. John to view both birds that inhabit the forest, wetlands and shorelines of St. John. Meet at Francis Bay Trailhead.
Monday—Wednesday 10:00 a.m.—2:00 p.m.	<b>Annaberg Cultural Program</b>	Annaberg Plantation was the largest sugar plantation in the history of St. John. Over 600 enslaved people were interred at Annaberg during the peak of its sugar production. The ruins of the factory structures, expertly built by enslaved people, are still largely intact. Cultural demonstrators are onsite to share their knowledge of how enslaved people made bread and grew crops to sustain themselves under unimaginably difficult circumstances.
Monday—Friday 10:00 a.m.—2:00 p.m.	<b>Annaberg Docents</b>	Our team of dedicated volunteers are at Annaberg five days per week to share their knowledge of the history of this site of conscience, where so many lives were upended. Hear tales of resistance to colonial rule, resilience in the face of abject cruelty, and learn about the skill and ingenuity of the people who built and operated this immense sugar refinery.
