



Finding A Grave



Andersonville National Cemetery remains active, currently serving as a final resting place for over 20,000 Americans. A computer in the lobby of the National Prisoner of War Museum provides information about the location of grave sites, including Union prisoner graves, other Civil War soldiers interred after the war, and modern-day interments. Park staff and volunteers are available to provide assistance.

- Respect the privacy of all funerals
- Do not photograph or record funeral services
- Do not approach open graves or cemetery equipment
- Do not sit on headstones or monuments
