Arlington House was the home of Robert E. Lee for over 30 years before the Civil War. George Washington Parke Custis, the grandson of Martha Washington, grew up at Mount Vernon, and built Arlington House as a memorial to George Washington. Upon marrying Custis' daughter, Mary, Lee lived in the home between his lengthy postings with the army throughout the country.
