

This is a strenuous, but spectacular day hike or backpacking trip. The entire loop is 14 miles round-trip. Temperatures may exceed 100°. There is NO WATER available along this trail. River water is not potable.



As the north fork nears the river, more trails are evident. A signed trail outside the canyon to the east parallels the river from above, and connects with the south fork. From the south fork, finding the north fork branch is difficult, but the junction is marked. Cairns are evident up the canyon of the north fork.
 The route along the river intersects with the south fork. The intersection is signed. The main trail continues the south

Carmen before descending 800 feet to the river through a steep canyon.

it veers right, then leaves the wash after 1/2 mile. It crosses a ridge offering good views of the river and the Sierra del

fork's descent to the river.

8. A more gradual, horse accessible trail that connects the Strawhouse and MV Trails. A metal sign marks the junction with the Strawhouse Trail.
