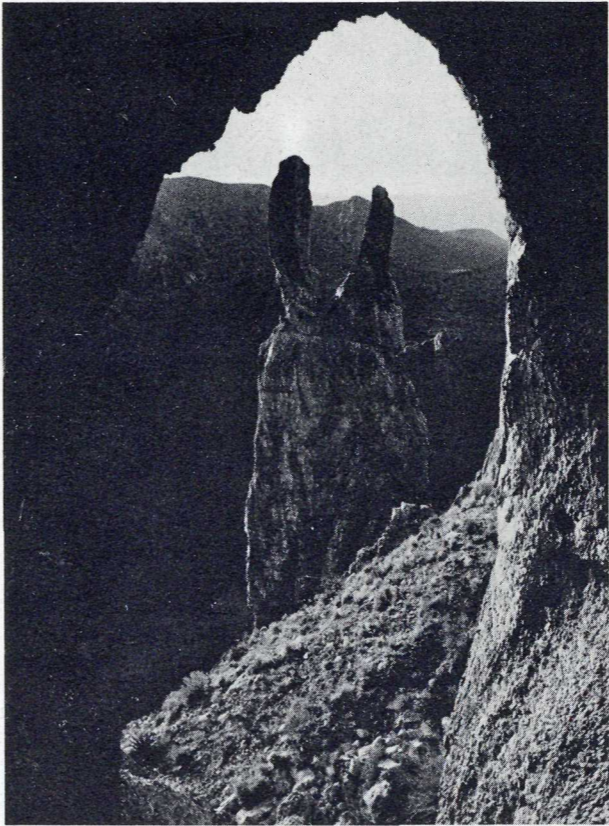

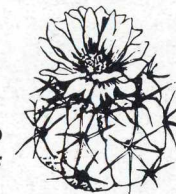

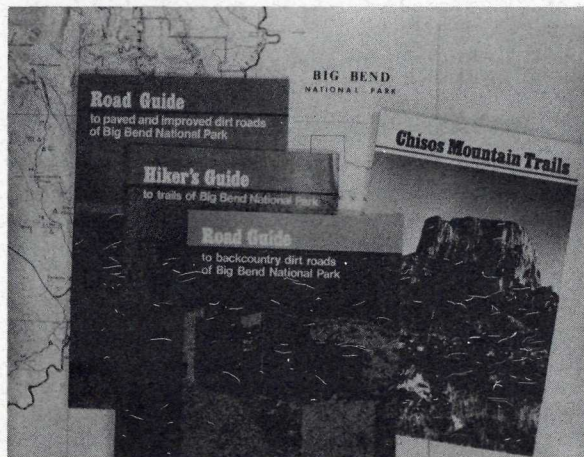

A FIELD GUIDE TO TEXAS SNAKES. \$14.95

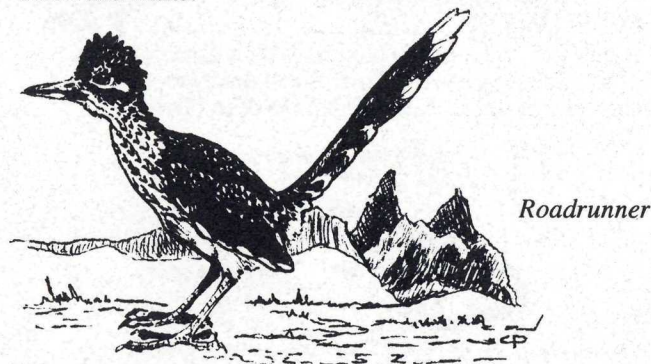
This 260 page work by Alan Tennant provides excellent color photographs and separate descriptive text and range maps.

This guide colorfully pictures and describes amphibians and reptiles other than snakes (see above). Range maps, ecology, and behavior discussed. 225 pages.

MAMMALS OF THE SOUTHWEST DESERT \$ 5.95

Profiles of 42 of the most common mammals and mammal families found in the Southwest, including badgers, wolves, and mountain lions (but not yet Big Bend's black bears); charming illustrations in color and black and white.
