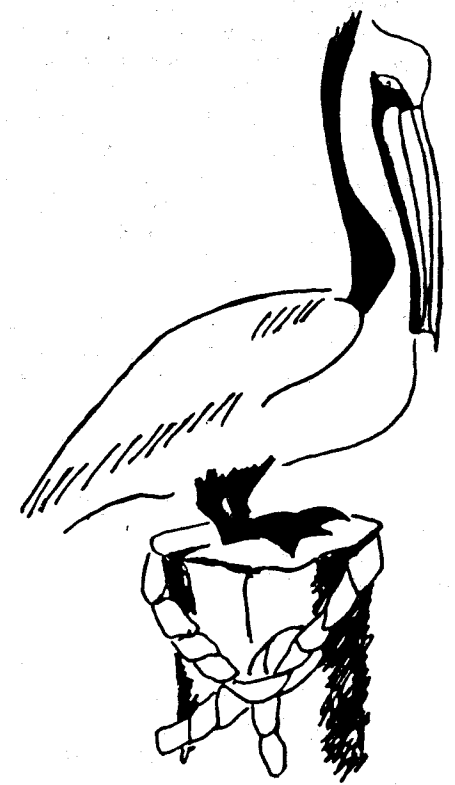

BIRD CHECKLIST**

Biscayne National Park is the largest marine sanctuary established by the National Park Service. Its 180,000 acres of pristine waters, mangrove shorelines, and 35 tropical islands provide ample habitat for a wide variety of birds. There are four significant and distinct biological systems within the park; certain species are associated with each of these areas. The park harbors many wading birds, of which eight are listed in the park. Biscayne Bay is a wintering area for the Pied-billed Grebe and the Red-breasted Merganser. Island populations include the White-crowned Nighthawk, a year-round resident. Over the reef tract and in the Gulf Stream, boobies and gannets can be sighted.

One aspect of watching birds within Biscayne is the possibility of finding accidental or pelagic species blown in from other areas. If you see any unusual birds (those listed as "accidental" at all), please advise park officials of your sighting.

The park contains 179 species of birds observed by individuals within Biscayne National Park. Those species are listed to occur much more commonly in one area of the park are followed by a notation of the areas in which they are found.

The visitor center is located nine miles east of Miami, Florida, on SW 328th Street (North Canal Road). Access to the park islands is possible only by boat.
