Ticket Information

Grandfather Mountain is **open daily all year** except Thanksgiving day and Christmas day and on bad-weather winter days. **Ticket sales** are 9 AM to 4 PM, winter; 9 AM to 5 PM, spring/fall; and 8 AM to 6 PM, summer. **The park closes one hour after ticket sales stop**. Average visit is 2 to 3 hours.

Because of sharp, hairpin curves near the top of the mountain, jointed vehicles and motor homes more than 28 feet in length are not permitted on the 2-mile summit road. Also for safety reasons, bicycles are not permitted.


