Born: Dec. 13, 1805, Newburyport, MA Died: May 24, 1879, New York City, NY Born in Massachusetts in 1805, William Lloyd Garrison was a leading figure in the abolitionist movement. For 35 years, he published The Liberator, the country's foremost abolitionist newspaper, which was strongly supported by Boston's free black community. At Faneuil Hall, he delivered some of his most powerful anti-slavery speeches. His constant agitation helped propel the nation to war.
