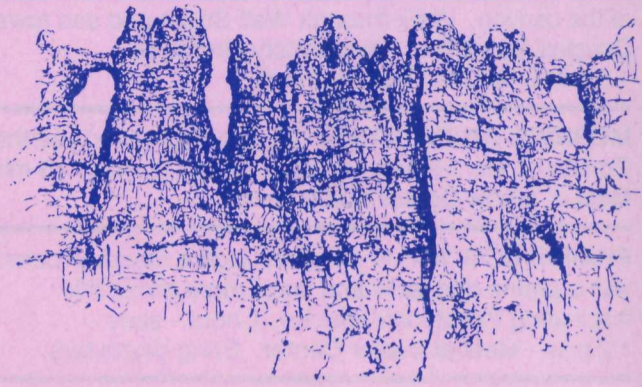

FEEDING KILLS WILDLIFE IN MANY WAYS

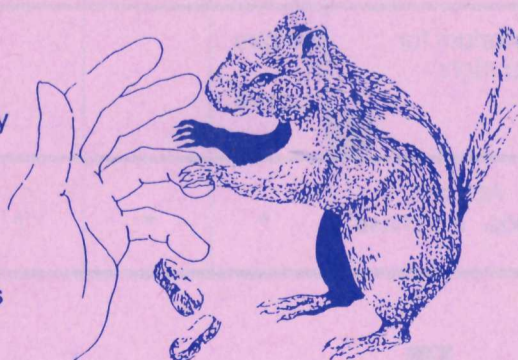
Some are lured to the roadside where they
are hit by passing cars.

Young animals do not develop good
feeding skills and starve.

Animals used to humans lose their natural
wariness and become easier for predators
to kill. Respect their wildness.

Food storing skills are not learned and
animals starve during winter months.

Snack foods, many of which are not
healthy for humans, are certainly not
healthy for wild animals.



Animals may bite, scratch or otherwise
harm the feeder and have to be destroyed.
Keep your distance for their safety as well
as yours.
