

Campground Rules

Camping:

- Select a vacant site, then register and pay your fee at the self-pay station.
- Walk-in tent sites have a lantern hook marked with a letter, while drive-in sites are numbered.
- Keep all vehicles, including trailers on paved surfaces. Additional parking is available near the pavilions and floater parking area.
- The maximum capacity per campsite is six people.
- Only one recreational vehicle is allowed per campsite.
- Quiet hours are from 10:00 pm to 6:00 am.
- Check-out time is 12:00 pm.
- Check-in time is 1:00 pm.
- Use lantern hangers as provided. Driving nails into and/or hanging lanterns from trees will cause damage.
- Make sure fires stay in the designated fire rings and grills. Do not leave fires unattended.
- Draining waste liquids from vehicles and/or recreational vehicles onto the ground is strictly prohibited.
- Reserving sites for others arriving later is prohibited.
- Pets must be on a six foot leash or under physical restraint at all times.
- Fireworks of any kind are strictly prohibited.

Roads and Trails:

- All trails within the Buffalo Point area are for foot traffic only.
- Buffalo Point has seven miles of trails, starting at the main trailhead between the Ranger Station and the restaurant.
- Pets are only welcome on the Buffalo Point Campground Trails (Forest, Overlook and Campground Trails).

Picnicking:

• Tables are located near the trailhead parking and floater parking areas.

Boating:

• North Maumee, Dillard's Ferry (at the base of Highway 14 Bridge), Buffalo Point and Rush are the designated access points for this district. Boats and tubes can be rented from authorized concessionaires near the park boundary. A list of vendors is available at the Ranger Station.

Cabins and Restaurants:

 The historic Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) cabins, modern duplexes and restaurant are managed by Buffalo Point Concessions at (870) 449-6206. Cabins are available for rent year round and the restaurant is open from Memorial Day to Labor Day. The Cabin Office is located east of the Ranger Station. The restaurant also has ice and firewood for sale during the open season.

Supplies and Services:

 Fuel, basic food and beverage items, ice, firewood, basic camping supplies, coin-operated laundry service and lodging are available at multiple locations between the park boundary and Yellville.
