


GENERAL INFORMATION

OCTOBER – NOT ARIZONA TIME.) Daytime temperatures April through November will range from 60° to 90°. Nighttimes require sweaters. Winter daytime temperatures are 45° to 60°. Winter wear is suggested. Altitude is 5500'. OPEN YEAR ROUND. NO PETS ALLOWED.




