A Year of Atmospheric Measurements

This July marks the end of the one-year deployment of the Department of Energy’s Atmospheric Radiation Measurement (ARM) Mobile Climate Research Facility at the Highlands Center. Over the past year, scientists have been collecting data related to aerosols— tiny particles in the air such as dust, soot and sea salt— and how they affect clouds and the climate.

In addition, scientists collected data through two 3-week airborne sampling campaigns. The flights took place at two intervals during the year-long deployment, in July 2012 and February 2013, to provide seasonal comparisons as part of the Two-Column Aerosol Project (TCAP). During these periods, a plane with measurement equipment flew out from Barnstable Municipal Airport, circled over the Highlands Center, then out to a point several hundred kilometers to the east and circled over the ocean, before returning to the airport. This allowed the team to gather aerosol data from two different areas, or columns.

We are pleased that the National Park Service’s Atlantic Research Center could host this research at the Highlands Center, knowing the data will not only be used to understand the climate around Cape Cod, but will help scientists better understand clouds and aerosols around the world and will help improve the accuracy of models used to predict future climate.

Happy 15th to Payomet Performing Arts Center!

Payomet has been at Highlands Center for seven years and had more than 5,000 people attend. Join in celebrating Payomet's 15th anniversary season with a full schedule of classes, children's programming, Shakespeare, and other theater and music performances at their Highlands Center tent. Two fully-staged theater productions will be performed by the Payomet troupe of professional actors! Shakespeare's beloved classic, *Twelfth Night*, opens on Wednesday, July 10 and runs for 20 performances through August 13. A special, shorter 45-minute version of *Twelfth Night* for children will be performed once or twice a week at 5 PM, followed by a 10 minute Q&A with the Payomet actors. Payomet's other main theater offering will be the world premiere of (*Enter Kurt Vonnegut*), a new work written and directed by Payomet Artistic Director Kevin Rice.

Noteworthy:

Payomet Performing Arts Center has received \$7,500 from the Massachusetts Cultural Council for a feasibility study of turning building T5 at the Highlands Center into its year-round headquarters to provide much needed office and rehearsal space, and performance space for children's theater productions. Payomet has agreed to fundraise an additional \$7,500 to go towards the project.

Music at the tent will start off with a Cajun-Zydeco Music & Dance mini-fest, the Jumpin Jambalaya Jam, on June 15. Other music dates feature Grammy winners as well as younger breakout artists, including Ben Taylor June 23, Rosanne Cash July 1, The Holmes Brothers July 6, Mavis Staples July 11, and Tom Rush September 14.
