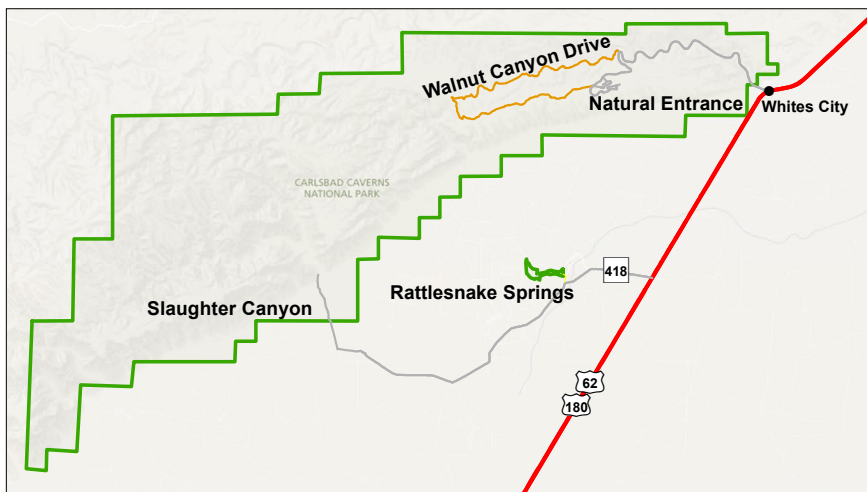


Beauty in Flight: The Birds of Carlsbad Caverns

While Carlsbad Caverns National Park (NP) contains one of the largest, deepest, and most ornate caves in North America, beauty and wonder exist both above and below ground. Birds are an important part of the above ground ecosystem at Carlsbad, although at least one species, the Cave Swallow, nests in the park's iconic caves.

Carlsbad Caverns NP contains a great diversity of birds, with 368 species having been documented. This large number of species includes birds that are year-round residents, neotropical migrants that nest in the park or pass through on the way to northern breeding grounds, winter residents, and occasional or accidental species that wander in and may stay awhile. With the diversity of birds found in the park and the presence of species such as Bell's Vireo, Gray Vireo, and Varied Bunting, Carlsbad Caverns is one of the best national parks in the country for birding.

Carlsbad Caverns NP is located in the northern portion of the Chihuahuan Desert, the most biologically diverse desert in the Western Hemisphere. The vegetation in most of the park is characterized by desert shrubs including small

junipers and oaks, and especially by an array of cacti along with other succulents like lecheguilla, sotol, and ocotillo. Look for wrens, doves, Northern Mockingbird, sparrows, and kingbirds in Carlsbad Caverns's shrublands and grasslands.

Elevations in the park range up to more than 6,300 feet. Ponderosa

pine and pinyon-juniper woodlands are found in the highest elevations, with woodland bird species such as woodpeckers, Woodhouse-Scrub-Jays, Say's Phoebe, and Great Horned Owls present in these habitats.

One of the most important parts of the park for birds is Rattlesnake Springs, an isolated unit that hosts a large number of bird species. Rattlesnake Springs is a unique ecosystem that functions as a true desert oasis, with forested wetlands dominated by cottonwood and willow, and grasses and sedges along the stream.

This vegetation provides important nesting habitat, especially for neotropical migratory birds. A large number of species breed at this site including Summer Tanager, Varied Bunting, Painted Bunting, Eastern Bluebird, Yellow-billed Cuckoo, and Orchard Oriole. Rattlesnake Springs also serves as an important stopover for occasional and accidental migrant species, including Least Flycatcher, Great Crested Flycatcher, Great Kiskadee, Carolina Wren, Hooded Warbler, Red-eyed Vireo, Blackburnian Warbler, Prothonotary Warbler, Black-throated Green Warbler, and Baltimore Oriole.

Rattlesnake Springs has been designated by the National Audubon Society as an Important Bird Area. Important Bird Areas support species of

conservation concern (e.g. threatened and endangered species), range-restricted species (species vulnerable because they are not widely distributed), species that are vulnerable because their populations are concentrated in one general habitat type, or species or groups of similar species (such as waterfowl or shorebirds) that are vulnerable because they occur at high densities due to their congregatory behavior.

The Southwestern Willow Flycatcher, a bird listed as Endangered, both federally and by the state, breeds at Rattlesnake Springs. The area's dense vegetation also provides an important breeding site in New Mexico for Bell's Vireo. Other rare birds to nest at Rattlesnake Springs include Indigo Bunting and Phainopepla. Gray Hawks have fledged young at the site in some recent years. Common Black Hawk, Neotropic Cormorant, Bald Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Broad-billed Hummingbird, Lucifer Hummingbird, and Baird's Sparrow have also been observed at Rattlesnake Springs.

Birding Ethics

Be mindful by following ethical birding guidelines that protect birds and enhance everyone's birding experience:

- » Keep your distance and avoid disturbing bird nesting sites; move away from alarmed pairs.
- » Report bird observations to park rangers at the visitor center. This helps other birders and supports research.
- » Do not use broadcasting calls to attract birds; calls interfere with nesting activity and may frustrate other birders.
- » Report rare species nesting sites to appropriate park officials only. Use caution when posting bird sightings over social media.
- » Do not set up bird feeding stations or feed birds in national parks.

Checklist Key

This checklist provides information on the abundance for each season for bird species found in Carlsbad Caverns NP.

Abundance

Abundance information is for suitable habitat.

- **C – Common:** May be seen daily but not in large numbers
- **U – Uncommon:** Likely to be seen monthly; may be locally common
- **R – Rare:** Present, but usually seen only a few times each year
- **O – Occasional:** Seen in the park at least once every few years, but not necessarily every year
- **Ac – Accidental:** Seen no more than a few times; birds that have strayed out of their normal range/habitat

Season

- **Summer** – June–July
- **Fall** – August–November
- **Winter** – December–March
- **Spring** – March–May

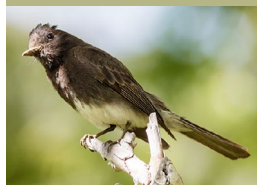

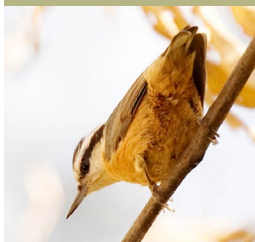

Visiting Carlsbad Caverns NP is a surefire way to see Cave Swallows. They nest inside the main cavern, making it easy to watch them fly in and out. When they enter a cave, they float down into it and fly back out in a spiral. They spend most of their time aloft, but head to the ground to collect tiny balls of mud or bat guano to build nests.

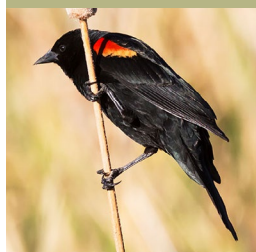
