


CARLSBAD. NEW MEXICO-Located in southeastern New Mexico, at an elevation of 3.110 feet above sea level. Carlsbad offers THE IDEAL climate for year-'round living. 





CARLSBAD CAVERNS NATIONAL PARK: Proclaimed by millions to be the world's first natural wonder. CARLSBAD CAVERNS is truly the FAIRYLAND OF THE WORLD. Created by the Master Designer, the symmetry and beauty surpasses every figment of imagination. TO BELIEVE, YOU MUST SEE. Located just 28 miles to the southwest of the City of Carlsbad, New Mexico, on Highway U. S. 62-180 and State Road 7, the Caverns are OPEN EACH DAY OF THE YEAR. Admission is \$1.50 for all persons 12 years of age and over. Members of Armed Forces admitted free. School groups and character forming organizations admitted free when accompanied by sponsor. Sponsors must pay regular admission. Temperature in the Caverns is uniformly 56°. Relative humidity is about 90%. A light wrap and comfortable walking shoes are recommended. DAILY TOURS are conducted by the National Park Service. For complete information on regular tours, elevator tours, photographic tours, etc., CONTACT THE CARLSBAD CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, CARLSBAD, NEW MEXICO.
