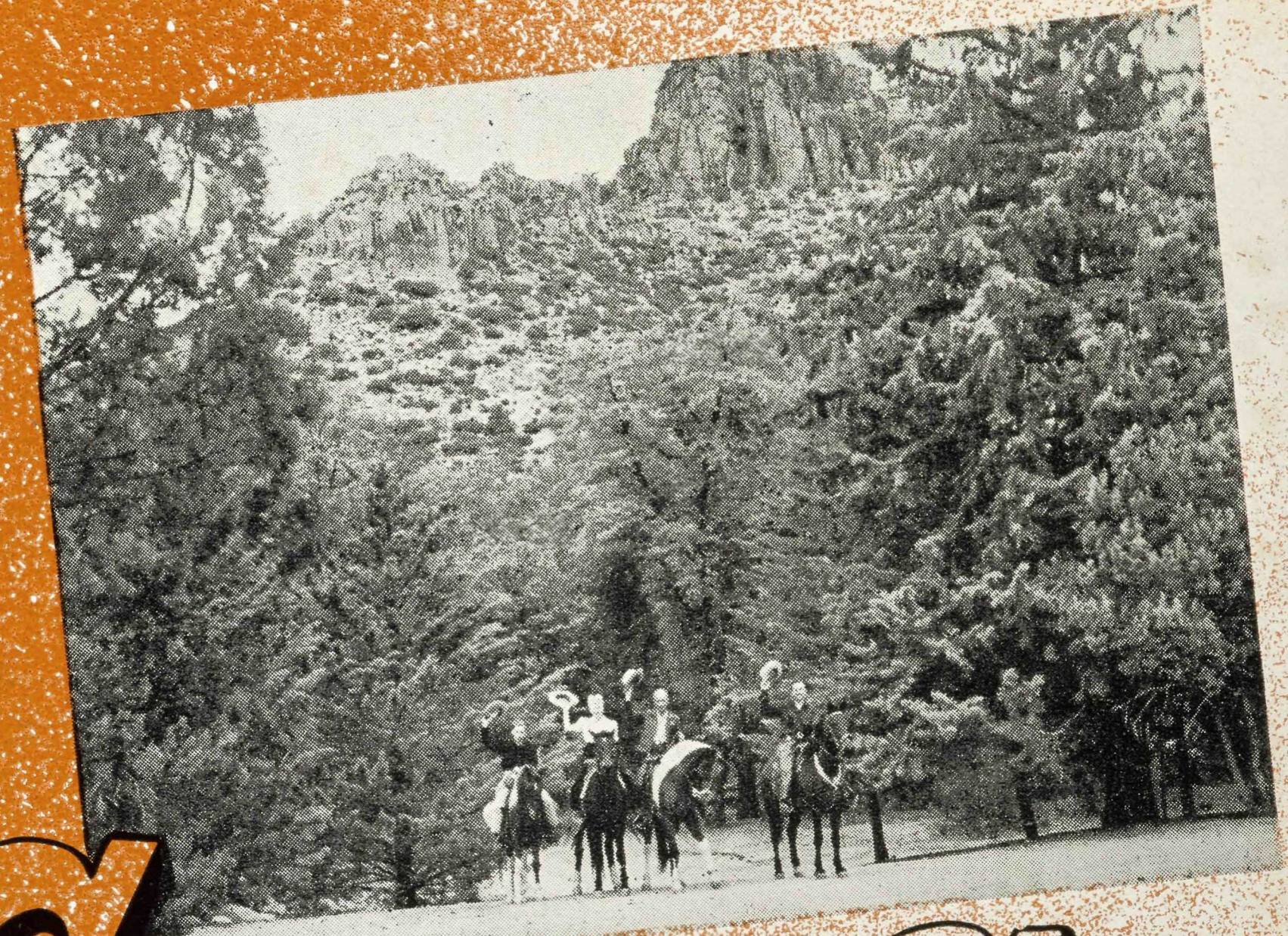

## The SILVER SPUR RANCH

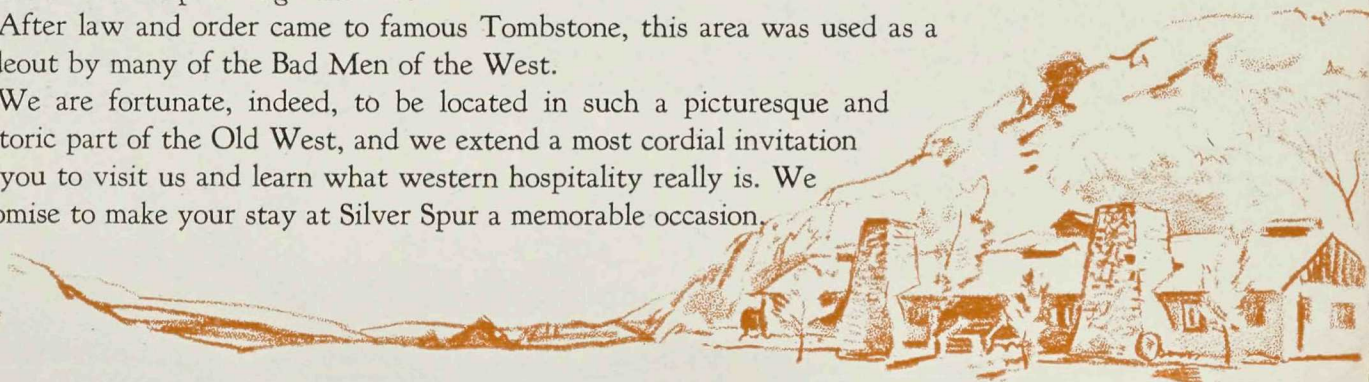
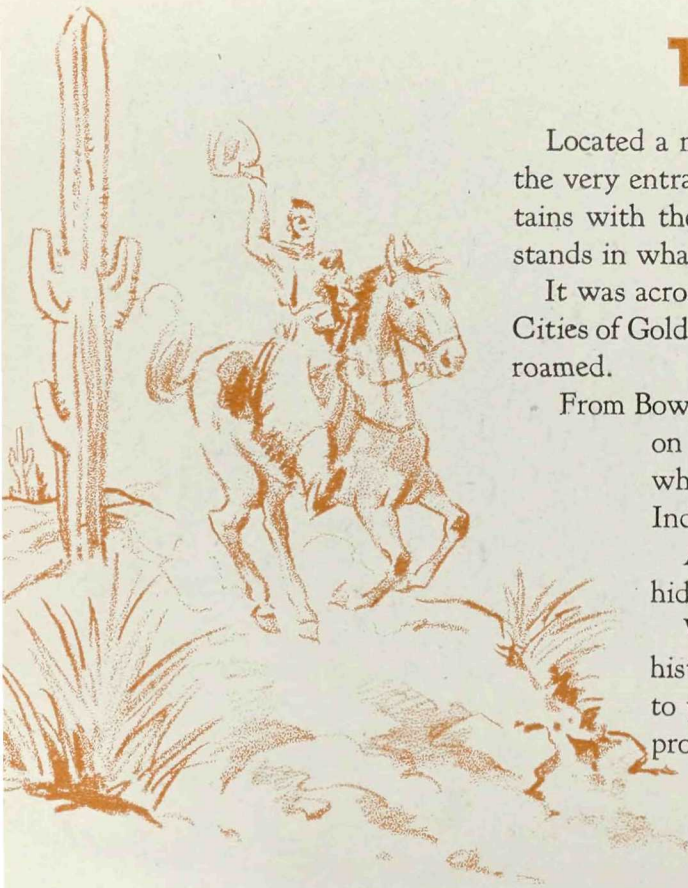
Located a mile high in the foothills of the Chiricahua Mountains, Arizona, the Silver Spur stands at the very entrance to the famous Chiricahua National Monument. It is surrounded by trees and mountains with the beautiful Sulphur Springs Valley to the West and the Dragoon Mountains beyond. It stands in what is truly one of Nature's beauty spots.

It was across this valley that the Conquistadors rode in the early 1500's in their search for the Seven Cities of Gold. And over these same mountains and valley Geronimo and his fierce band of Apache Indians roamed.

From Bowie through famed Apache Pass and across the valley, once roared the Old Butterfield Stage on its way from St. Louis to San Diego. Soldiers from Ft. Bowie, the remains of which can still be seen, stood guard to make sure the stage was not waylaid by Indians on its trip through the Pass.

After law and order came to famous Tombstone, this area was used as a hideout by many of the Bad Men of the West.

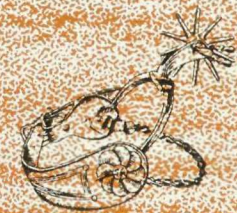
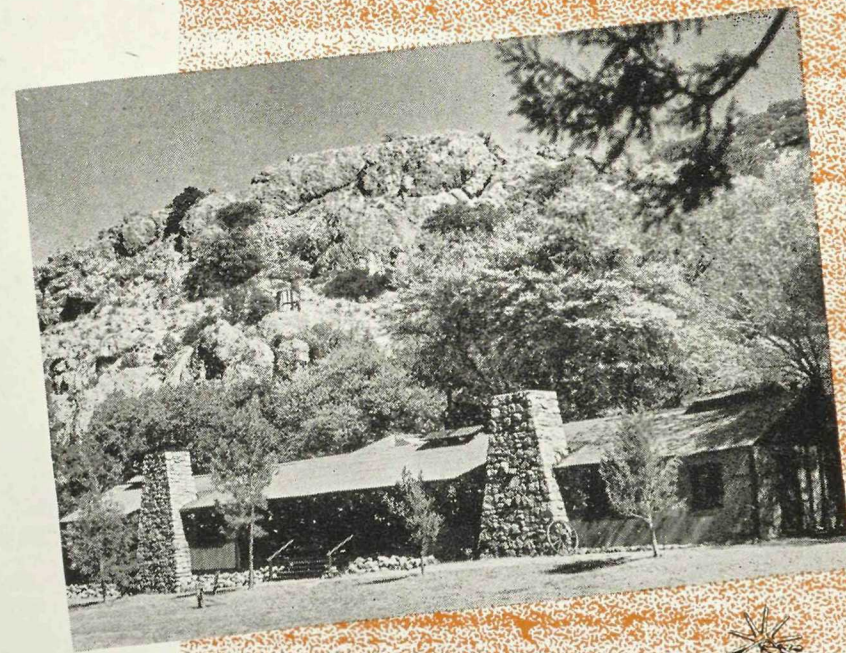

And what food! Everyone thoroughly enjoys the delicious meals served here at the Silver Spur in genuine ranch style.

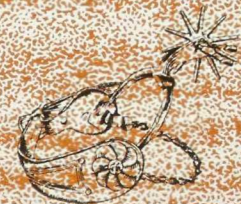




## THE LOUNGE

You do what you want to do at the Silver Spur. For here no attempt is made at organized entertainment. You'll enjoy the informality of our way of life.

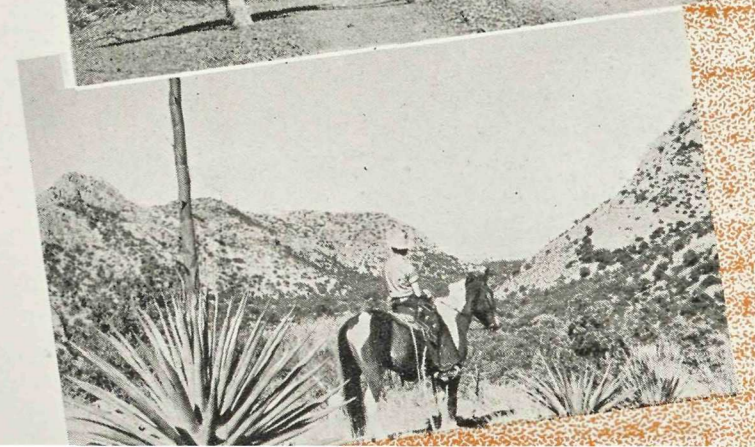
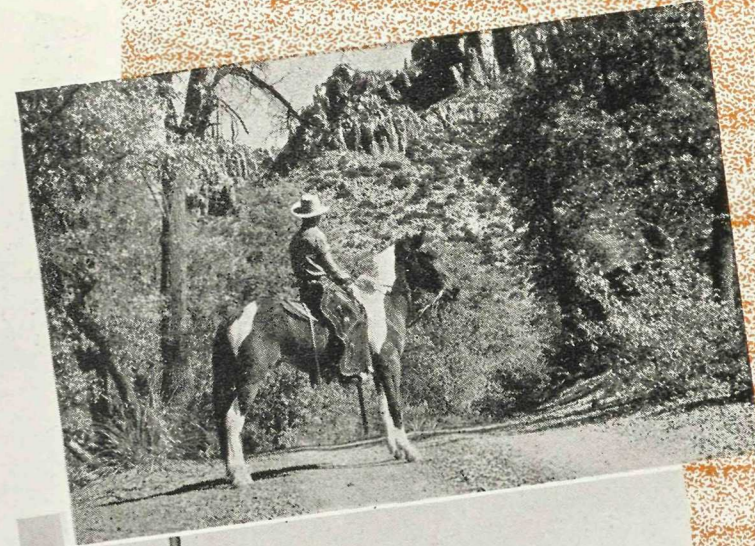


## ON THE TRAIL

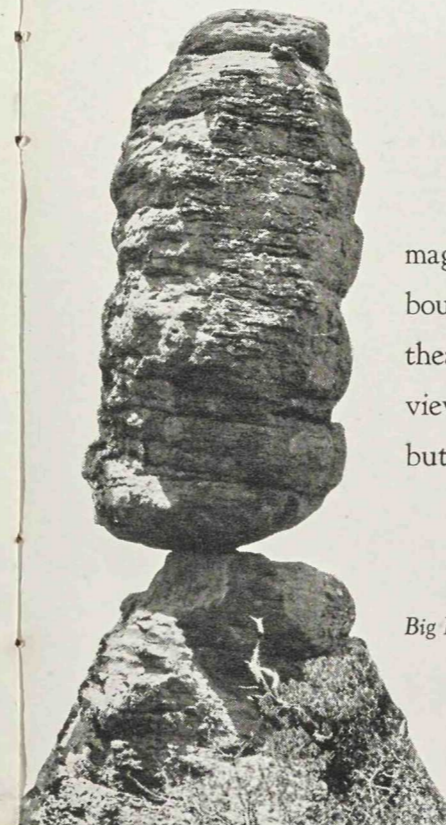
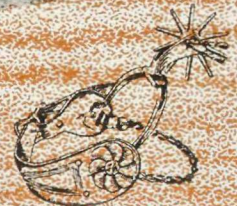
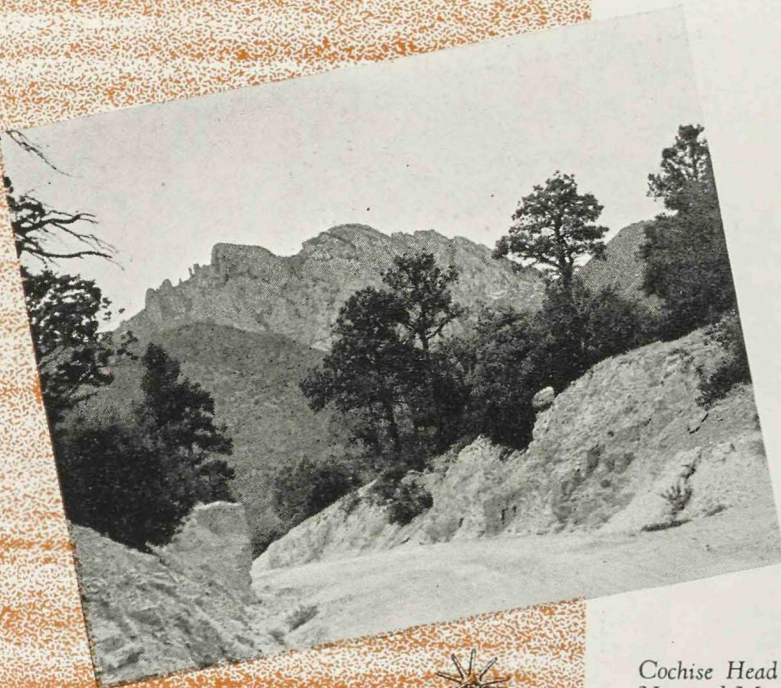


## CHIRICAHUA NATIONAL MONUMENT

The Chiricahua (pronounced Cheer-e-cow-ah) National Monument is one of the southwest's most spectacular scenic wonders. It is a vast area of eroded rock formations and is known as the Wonderland of Rocks.

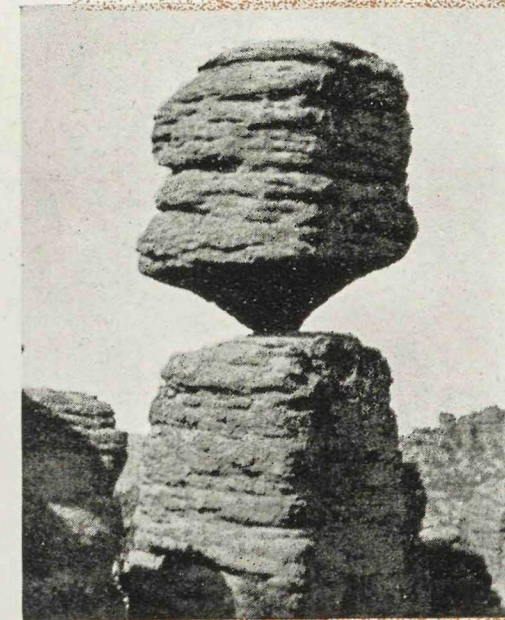
The Silver Spur Ranch is located at the entrance to this Wonderland. Horse trails leading directly from the ranch into it afford

magnificent views of mighty columns and tower-like spires, huge boulders amazingly balanced on slender bases and walled amphitheatres. From Massai Point at the summit of the trail, a remarkable view is to be had, embracing not only the entire Wonderland area but also the wide expanse of Sulphur Springs Valley.



## NEARBY POINTS OF INTEREST

Among the countless interesting points located within a half day's travel or less from the Silver Spur Ranch are the modern city of Douglas, adjacent to historic Agua Prieta, in Old Mexico; historic Tombstone; the storied Apache Pass; Ft. Bowie; the Geronimo Surrender Monument; the immense open pit copper mines at Bisbee, and the cattle shipping center of Willcox.
