KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Dr. Sylvia Earle

National Geographic Society's Explorer-in-Residence and former chief scientist for the U.S. National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), Sylvia Earle is author of more than 125 scientific and popular publications. Her research involves the development of technology for access and research in the deep sea. She is one of very few people who have been to the bottom of Crater Lake in a submarine.

LOCATION

Friday's keynote speech and Saturday's activities will be held at Southern Oregon University. Sunday's activities will be held at Crater Lake National Park. Round trip transportation to the Park will be available for \$5/person on a space available basis. Advance purchase recommended.
