Desoween VII: October 24th from 6:30pm-9pm

Desoween VII: Camp Desoween is De Soto's spooky trail walk. Campers have run amuck and something sinister is behind it. Are you brave enough to go into the woods at dark? Event suggested for children and adults ages 7 and up. The darker it gets, the spookier it is!

Camp Uzita Living History: Every Day from December 5th through April 15th from 10-3 Daily

They have played in festivals and theaters all over the world and are cultural musical ambassadors for the Chickasaw nation.

Five Centuries of Florida History Weekend: March 19th through the 20th 10:00am-3:00pm

Come experience 500 years of history. Over 30 re-enactors portraying men and women from Florida's extensive history. All time periods set up camps and displays with talks and demonstrations throughout the weekend.

De Soto Landing: April 16th 10:00am and 1:00pm

Be here as conquistador Hernando De Soto comes ashore and claims Florida. Stay all day as we provide talks and demonstrations about De Soto's expedition and its lasting impact on early American history, and the native people of the Southeast.
