Walk or bike to Harmony Borax Works. 1.2 miles. (H) Desolation Canyon... Explore moon-like landscape. 1/2 mile. (M) Golden Canyon Interpretive Trail... Badlands. Slight grade. 1 mile. (H) Mustard Canyon... Start at Harmony Borax Works. Walk or bike through canyon. Automobile access. 3/4 mile. (M) Tea House Viewpoint... Start at Furnace Creek Inn. Uphill. 1/4 mile. (M) Mosaic Canyon... Marble-like canyon. 1/2 to 2 miles. (M) Mud Canyon... Pursue any one of various gullies within the canyon. 1/2 to 2 miles. (L) Salt Creek Interpretive Trail... Look for birds and desert pupfish. Wheelchair access. 1/2 mile, (M) MODERATE TRAILS: Borax Haystacks... Start at Harmony Borax Works. Walk in salt pan to see where borates were mined. 3 miles, level. (L) Golden Canyon to Zabriskie Point... Near end of Golden Canyon, follow hiking symbol and signposts to Zabriskie Point. Uphill, very dry. 2.5 miles. (M) Return by Gower Gulch (dry river bed) for loop trail. Hole-in-the-Rock Spring... Start 1.3 miles above Hell's Gate on the road to Beatty. Hike northward. 1/3 mile. (L) Keane Wonder Mill... Follow pipeline north to several springs. Level, 1 mile. (L) Salt Creek to McLean Spring ... At the far end of the boardwalk, get off and follow trail over badlands to source of creek (the spring may not be evident). 2 miles. (L) Sand Dunes... Park at picnic area or at guide-dispenser box (Highway 190). 1 mile or more, up and down. (M) Titus Canyon Narrows... Park on Death Valley side of canyon. 4.5 miles to Klare Spring and petoglyphs. Automobile access (heading west). (M) MORE DIFFICULT TRAILS: Grotto Canyon... Includes a half-mile of climbing dry falls. 2 1/2 miles from Highway 190. 1/2 mile from end of 4wd road. (L) Keane Wonder Mine... Follow tramway uphill. Very steep. From mine, continue to Chloride City and other ruins. 1 mile to mine. (M) Echo Canyon... Alluvial fan and canyon walking. 6 miles. Automobile access. (L) Trail Canyon... Alluvial fan and canyon walking. 8 miles. Automobile access. (M) Corkscrew Peak... Walk in wash across from road sign. 7 miles. (L) Wildrose Peak... Trail begins behind Charcoal Kilns. 4 miles. (L) Mileages listed are one-way. Carry water, and wear sturdy shoes. Avoid hiking in temperatures over 90°F.
