In 1913 there was 4.54 inches of rain recorded; the maximum temperature was 134 degrees F., and the minimum temperature was 15 degrees F.

The longest period of having over 100 degrees F maximums was for 134 days in the summer of 1974.

The highest ground temperature recorded was 210 degrees F. at Furnace Creek on July 15, 1972. The maximum air temperature for that day was 128 degrees F.

Data on weather was compiled from the monuments daily records, and the National Meather Service summaries for the years 1911 through 1984 for Death Valley Calif.
