

Long Pine Key Campground

Regulations

- Only one primary camping unit (RV) and one secondary unit (tent), or two tents may occupy a campsite.
- Maximum of eight people and two vehicles per campsite. Do not park on grass.
- Check-out time is 11:00 AM.
- Campground speed limit is 15 MPH. Obey all traffic signs.
- Fires permitted in grills only. Fires must be attended at all times.
- Do not feed or harass any wildlife.
- Quiet hours are from 10:00 PM to 6:00 AM.
- Generators may be operated from 8:00 AM to 8:00 PM only.
- All food and food preparation equipment, when not in use, must be kept sealed in a vehicle or hard-sided camping unit.
- Do not leave garbage out. Dispose of all garbage and recyclable material in the dumpsters provided.
- Washing of dishes, food, clothing, or other property, and bathing at public water faucets is prohibited. Utility sinks for dishwashing are located in the rear of each restroom.
- Wastewater drainage of any kind is prohibited. Use the dump station for sewage and gray water disposal.
- Do not tie lines or attach anything to the trees for any reason.
- Pets must be kept on a leash (maximum of 6 feet in length) at all times. Pets are not allowed on unpaved roads or trails, they are only allowed in the campground and in parking lots. Do not leave pets unattended. Please remember to clean up after your pet.
- No swimming in lakes or ponds. Fishing is permitted with a Florida State Fishing License.

General Information

Campsites cost \$16 per night or \$8 per night for Golden Age and Golden Access Passport holders. The group campsite costs \$30 per night and is limited to tents only, allowing up to 8 tents and a maximum of 15 people. No water, electric, or sewer hook-ups are available anywhere in the park. Grills and picnic tables are provided at each site. The campground has restrooms with running water but no showers.

How to Get a Campsite

Campsites are available on a first-come, first- served basis.

Limitations

Camping within Everglades National Park is limited to 30 days in a calendar year, with a maximum stay of 14 days during the winter season (November 1st through April 3. Extensions may be granted on a day by day basis. No extensions available December 25-January 4, January 16-19, or February 13-16.

Flamingo Campground

Regulations

- No swimming in lakes or ponds. Fishing is permitted with a Florida State Fishing License.

General Information

Campsites cost \$16 per night or \$8 per night for Golden Age and Golden Access Passport holders. No water, electric, or sewer hook-ups are available anywhere in the park. Grills and picnic tables are provided at each site. The campground has restrooms with running water and cold-water showers.

How to Get a Campsite

Campsites are available on a first-come, first- served basis or by reservation.

Reservation can be made starting November 20 and no reservations will be taken after March 1. Reservations can be made by calling (800) 365-CAMP (2267) or on the World Wide Web at http://reservations.nps.gov

For after-hours arrivals, check the instructions on the kiosk bulletin board.
