TRAILS

Most of the flagstone at Fort Union is original. They are uneven and can pose a tripping hazard. For your safety as well as the preservation of our resources, please stay on the gravel trail and keep



your pets on a leash. Stay off foundations and please do not touch the adobe walls, they are fragile.

ARTIFACTS

As you walk along the path, you may see a bullet or maybe

a button. Please remember, it is against the law to disturb or remove any artifacts that you may find on the grounds. Please leave them for the enjoyment of others.

WILD LIFE

Wild creatures inhabit the area. The prairie rattlesnake and other wildlife are commonly



found on the grounds of Fort Union. Remain alert, and remember this is their natural habitat. Report rattlesnake sightings to a Park Ranger.

STORMS

Thunderstorms are common on the high plains, especially during the months of July thru September. Be alert for oncoming storms, and should lightning appear imminent, return to the visitor center immediately.
