- B Cedar Post, standing five feet out of the ground - hewed sides square and branched rough face with "G. G."
- C Cedar Post like the 1<sup>st</sup> 1844 100 yds from S.W. Corner of a Tree Balm & Lead six feet in circumference. 100 yds from Cedar Post South West Corner - 1/2 mile beyond Reservoir very low water marks.

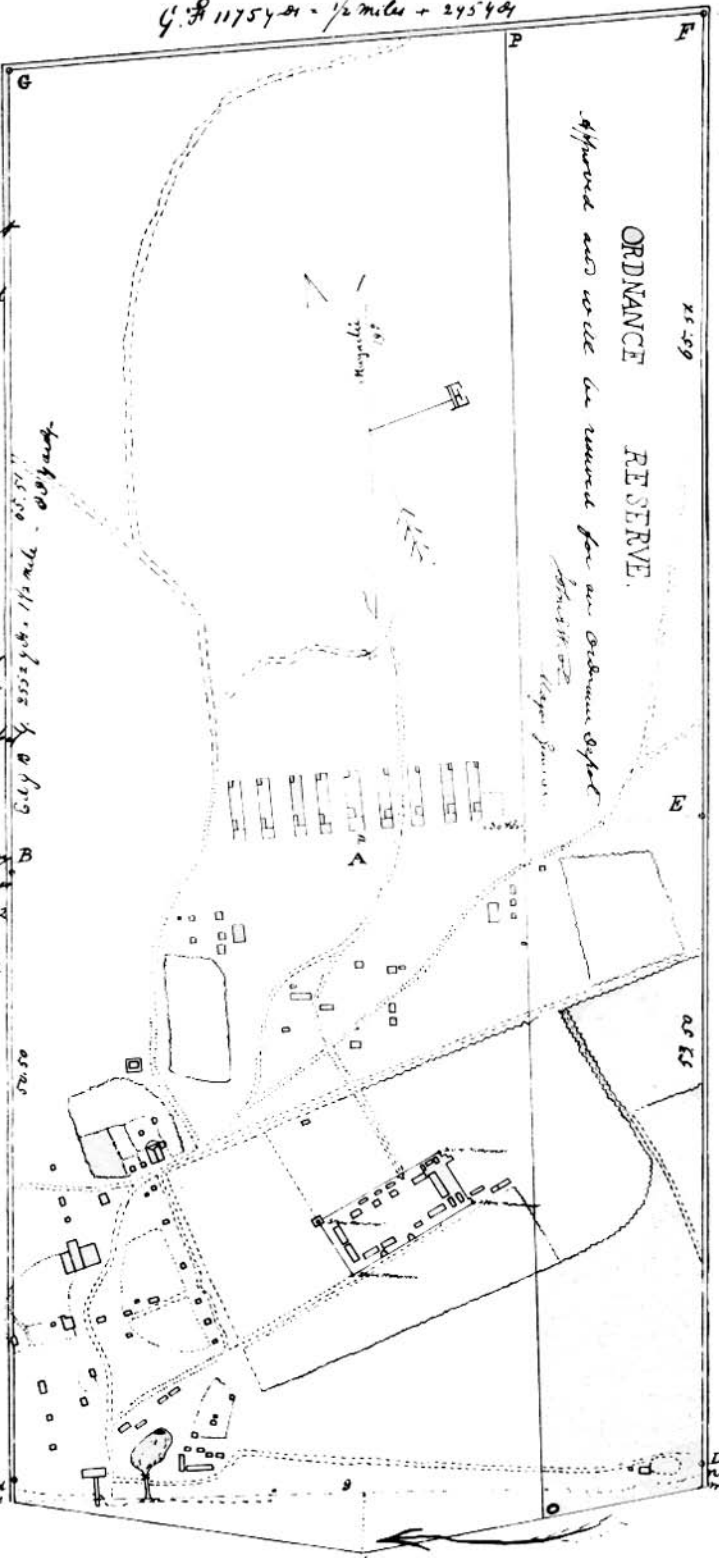
Ch m. Southern Boundary eastwardly up the river with official h. g. of 500 feet in South East Corner. A very low water mark.

n. A Tree Balm of Lead 10 ft round on East Boundary 150 yards from S.E. Corner. D A Cedar Post like 1 & 2.

Standing on the E. Boundary line 177 yards from S.E. Corner. E, F & G Cedar Post like 1 & 2. Marking the boundary. S.E. and S.E. & N. Corner at F & C.
