Vision Statement

The vision for Herbert Hoover National Historic Site for the Centennial of the National Park Service in 2016 is to ensure that the natural and cultural resources that serve as symbols of significant events that influenced the character and career of Herbert Hoover are maintained through our strategies for the future.

Herbert Hoover's death in October of 1964 prompted interest in establishing a national historic site in his honor. An April 1965 National Park Service report, "A Proposed Herbert Hoover Birthplace National Historic Site," concluded that the West Branch site had "unquestionable national significance" and should be added to the national park system. Public law 89-119, dated August 12, 1965, authorized the establishment of Herbert Hoover National Historic Site.

The purpose of Herbert Hoover National Historic Site is and will continue to be the foundation of the vision for the future. Preserve the Birthplace Cottage, Gravesite, and other historically significant properties associated with the life of Herbert Hoover. Provide an accessible, dignified, and spacious setting in which visitors can experience the Birthplace Cottage, Gravesite, Presidential Library, and other resources. Commemorate and interpret the life, career, and accomplishments of Herbert Hoover in cooperation with other organizations.

The vision for 2016 and beyond is that Herbert Hoover National Historic Site is still known for providing an exceptional quality experience. The grounds, facilities and resources are well maintained, safe and fully accessible. All buildings, including historic structures always look presentable to the public and the buildings look freshly painted all the time. The grounds are free from invasive species, the cultural landscape is a serene and simple setting, and there are no intrusions on the site not associated with Hoover. Interpretive products are informative and provocative for all visitors to the site. The Historic Site and its partners pool their resources and streamline their operations so that the pursuit of common goals is as seamless as the walk from the Presidential Library to the Birthplace Cottage. Partnerships with the Herbert Hoover Presidential Library-Museum, the Hoover Association, Main Street-West Branch and the community of West Branch, Iowa continue to be positive collaborative relationships. Other partnerships are developed and maintained to encourage and assist the park with stewardship, environmental leadership, recreational experiences, education and professional excellence. The park workforce is diverse, professional and motivated to meet the future goals of the Historic Site and the National Park Service.

Identify and seek partners and funding for lead paint abatement of 10 historic structures located at Herbert Hoover National Historic Site. This project will also assist in either bringing structures up to good condition or maintaining them in good condition.

Manage the tributary stream beginning now in an aesthetically pleasing manner in a way that allows for future re-contouring of the stream course.

Action:

Achieve a consensus for the design and management of the stream banks, and implement this strategy. Possibly use the small store of prairie seed on hand to seed newly exposed bare dirt along the stream banks.

Action:

Partner with other NPS sites, local master gardeners' groups and other local partners to attract volunteers to create and maintain the gardens and flower beds around the site.

Performance Goal:

Increase efforts to reach diverse audiences and young people to visit Herbert Hoover National Historic Site.

Action:

Continue to work with our partners including the Herbert Hoover Presidential Library and Museum, the Hoover Association, Silos and Smokestacks NHA, Eastern Iowa Tourism Association, State of Iowa Tourism, and the community and organizations of West Branch to promote and target audiences to visit this lesser-known site.

Resume the park's use of the Iowa Communications Network to reach other schools in Iowa with programming associated with the site. Continue to expand efforts with Presidential Library and Museum with programming opportunities.

Action:

Improve the park's website as an education and interpretive tool by emphasizing the park's resources; including the Birthplace Cottage, Historic Core, Gravesite, and Commemorative Landscape. The draft Long-Range Interpretive Plan provides recommendation for improving the website.

Action:

Partner with local Public Library and Recreation Department to conduct special Junior Ranger day programs at the park and work with children at the Public Library on their computers to perform Web Ranger activities for other parks after attending the Junior Ranger day program.

- Impart to every American a sense of their citizen ownership of their national parks.
 - Increase visitors' satisfaction, understanding, and appreciation of the parks they visit.

Action:

The draft Long-range Interpretive Plan will be finalized in February 2008. The park is currently working with partners to address the recommendations, including assistance with funding for new permanent exhibits and waysides, as well as other non-personal and personal services.
