A BRIEF NOTE ABOUT THE CONTENTS

The bibliographic information contained in this booklet was compiled in 1997 as part of a Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA) project to document native and non-native burial practices within the boundaries of Gates of the Arctic National Park and Preserve (GAAR).

Part 1 is an unannotated bibliographic listing of literature pertaining to cultural resources within GAAR.

Part 2 contains annotations for each work and comments on relevance to GAAR and the grave site study. Library locations and call numbers are included for convenience. "UAF" indicates that the item may be found at the University of Alaska Fairbanks library. "GAAR library" indicates that the work is available in the park library at the Fairbanks office. Several works have no annotation because they were either located too late or were unobtainable. These are included because their titles suggest that they may contain useful and relevant information.

PLEASE NOTE: Although the two bibliographies share much of the same information they are not identical. Works listed in one may not appear in the other.
