

The Battle of Gettysburg

Fact: The Union victory at Gettysburg saw more total casualties than any other Civil War battle. The battle of Gettysburg raged July 1-3, 1863 in south-central Pennsylvania. More than 150,000 soldiers between both sides fought during the struggle, with almost 51,000 of those men becoming casualties of the battle. Although considered a turning point in the Civil War, Gettysburg did not decide the conflict and the war continued for two more years.
