

How Do I Register? Instructions for registering for your campsite are found at the entrance of each campground or each campground loop. Select a site, fill out the envelope completely and deposit in the locked tube. Save your receipt.



Campsite Capacity

Limit of 8 people per site. Larger families use multiple or group sites where available. Group site limit is 15. Campsite use is limited to 2 vehicles only one of which is designed for habitation. Pitch tents off all vegetation. A towed trailer that is designed for habitation and its towing unit is considered one vehicle.

Where Do I Park? Parking space is limited. Please park all wheeled vehicles in the space provided near each campsite. Leave tables, grates, logs and large rocks as you find them.

How Long Can I Stay? 7 days is the limit in July and August. 14 days maximum in a calendar year.

Please leave the site as you found it!

Digging, trenching or leveling the ground causes erosion and is unnecessary. Do not drive nails or strip bark from trees. Leave flowers for others to enjoy.

flow facilities and roadside camping or sleeping in vehicles is prohibited.

General Information


No utility hook-ups are provided in any park campgrounds.

All campgrounds are operated on a first-come, first-serve basis.

No advance reservations accepted.

Showers are available for a nominal fee at Rising Sun and Swiftcurrent Motor Inns on the east side of the park. Showers on the west side are available at privately owned campgrounds located outside the park.

Anyone Home?

We suggest a string with a paper plate across the entrance to your site. "site occupied" with your name and date will show the site is taken. Do not place bags over the numbered site posts as rangers may need to locate a site in an emergency. If you will be gone more than 24 hours, please tell a ranger. Please remove all string, signs, etc. when vacating the site.



Pets

Pets must be on a leash of 6 feet or less, caged, or in vehicles at all times. Pets are not permitted on trails or in the backcountry under any circumstances.



Fires And Firewood Use only wood which is **dead and down** on the ground. Cutting of live or dead standing trees is prohibited. Chainsaws are not permitted. Firewood can be bought at most campstores. Please keep your fire inside the grate and attended at all times. **Be sure your fire is dead out when leaving.**



Food and Bears


Glacier is bear country! When it is not being consumed, all food, coolers. cooking utensils and food containers must be kept in a closed vehicle that is constructed of solid, non-pliable material, day or night. Several campgrounds have food lockers or bear poles for those camping without a suitable vehicle. Ask a ranger for their location. Otherwise, food must be suspended at least 10 feet from any post, tree trunk or limb. Food and beverage left on tables or stored in tents or in open containers in vehicles are invitation to bears. Pet food and garbage must be properly stored at all times. Improperly stored and unattended food is a violation, and will be confiscated.



Trailer Refuse Trailer and RV owners must provide receptacles to catch and contain wastewater. Wastewater from drain hoses must be contained. Wastewater may be disposed of in utility sinks, toilets or RV dump stations. Human waste must be disposed of in toilets or RV dump stations.



Water And Electricity Dishwashing, bathing, doing laundry or cleaning fish at water faucets is prohibited. Dispose of wastewater in the utility sinks or toilets located in restroom facilities. Individual hookups to water, sewage or electrical outlets is prohibited.



Quiet Hours Sh-h-h-h! Your neighbor may be sleeping! Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Radios, tape players, generators, vehicles, etc. must not be operated at a time or in such a manner that would unreasonably disturb others. Fireworks and other unnecessary disturbances are prohibited at all times. Please be considerate of your neighbor.
