

RECOGNIZING 100 YEARS OF NATURAL AND CULTURAL PRESERVATION

Since Congress established it in 1910, Glacier National Park has evolved from its early status as a "public pleasuring ground" and rustic tourist destination to a protected, yet accessible, repository of nationally significant cultural and natural resources. Although the Blackfeet, Salish, Pend d'Oreille, Kootenai and other native peoples inhabited the area for at least 10,000 years prior to the park's creation, most Americans discovered its natural wonders and rich cultural heritage after its official designation as a park. Much of the park's natural landscape remains as it once was, but twentieth-century developments in technology, politics, society and science have wrought changes in visitor accommodations, park infrastructure, management policies and the nature of the overall visitor experience.

2010, the park's 100th year, provides us with a rare opportunity to acknowledge and examine this century-long transformation of the park from what it was to what it is and, most importantly, to contemplate the nature of its future.





The campaign includes legacy projects and endowments established to commemorate this historic event and will set the stage for our beloved park's next 100 years.


The Centennial Legacy Projects represent the shortterm goals and were identified through listening sessions and feedback from our park visitors. In addition to the legacy projects, which are being undertaken as a birthday gift for the park, GNPF will help fund other centennial programs and events. GNPF invites you to help them reach the goal of \$250,000 and make these projects a reality in 2010.

Centennial Legacy Projects include:

- Increase the number of accessible trails in Many Glacier
- Build a Watchable Wildlife viewing platform
- Preserve Heavens Peak Fire Lookout
- Upgrade Logan Pass Visitor Center exhibits
- Develop 'People in Glacier' education materials
- Restore Dark Skies Initiative
- Continue 'Citizen Science in Glacier's High Country'
