

Trips are available from Many Glacier Corral, Lake McDonald Corral and Appar Village.

TRAIL RIDES IN GLACIER NATIONAL PARK

Saddle horse service in Glacier National Park is operated by Rocky Mountain Outfitters, Inc. Mailing address is Columbia Falls, Montana. This enterprise is under contract with the National Park Service. Rates for trail rides within Glacier Park are approved by the National Park Service.

Arrangements for rides can be made at the transportation desks in the hotels or by contacting the saddle horse guides at the corral.

All Day Rides

Poia Lake — A scenic ride over Swiftcurrent Ridge, in to the Kennedy Creek drainage, as far as Poia Lake.

Granite Park Chalet — A ride over Swiftcurrent Pass, one of the most scenic in the Park to a chalet built of rock in a high alpine setting. There should be numerous mountain goats seen on this trip. We suggest an overnight stay at the Chalet if you desire.

Siyeh Glacier — Above Cracker Lake. Visit the abandoned copper mine. Ranger naturalist conducted twice a week.

Six Hour Rides -

Cracker Lake — A ride along Lake Sherburne to Canyon Creek then climbing switch-backs along the alpine valley to Cracker Lake.

Swiftcurrent Ridge Lake — A climb along the northern edge of the Swiftcurrent Valley east to Swiftcurrent Ridge Lake.

Three Hour Rides

Grinnell Lake — Nestled in a glacial cique at the foot of the mountain thousands of feet beneath Grinnell Glacier. A spectacular and easy trip for anyone who has never ridden before.

Red Rock Falls — A level and easy trip for anyone who has never ridden before along the Swiftcurrent Valley floor past Swiftcurrent Lake, Fishercap Lake and Red Rock Lake, to Red Rock Falls located at the head of Red Rock Lake.

Two Hour Rides -

Josephine Lake — An easy ride along the lower Josephine Lake trail through alpine forest and meadows to Josephine Lake then a gentle climb up to the Pagan Trail looking down on Josephine Lake.

Cracker Flats — A ride along Lake Sherburne and the Governors Pond to Cracker Flats where the town of Alton once stood at the turn of the century.

One Hour Rides -

Along the lower Josephine Lake trail and the upper Pagan Trail. An easy ride for the beginner, young child, or senior citizen. These rides are available throughout the day, when horses and guides are available.

All Day Rides -

Sperry Chalet — An easy ride in itself to a beautiful chalet built of natural rock in a high alpine setting with a spectacular view. You may arrange to stay there overnight and hike to further points if you desire.

Trout Lake or Arrow Lake — Trips for the fisherman. Spectacular catches have been taken in both of these lakes. Very scenic trips which we know will satisfy your desire for lovely mountain scenery.

Three Hour Rides -

Paradise Valley — After crossing the rustic bridge on McDonald Creek you enter the beautiful Paradise Valley with its magnificent flowers and towering trees. Wildlife such as moose, bear and deer are often seen on this trail.

Two Hour Rides -

To McDonald Falls [for novices] — An easy scenic ride to beautiful McDonald Falls, leaving the horse corral every two hours: 8:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m., 1:00 p.m., & 3:00 p.m., mountain daylight time.

All Day Rides -

A scenic ride across the McDonald Creek to the abandoned Flathead Ranger Station.

Six Hour Ride -

A scenic ride across the McDonald Creek to the abandoned fire lookout. From the vantage point at the lookout, you may see the beautiful McDonald Valley and other points in the Park and Flathead National Forest.

Three Hour Rides -

A scenic ride across McDonald Creek to a beautiful overlook on the Middle Fork of the Flathead River.

Two Hour Rides -

A gentle sloping ride along the scenic McDonald Creek to view pristine meadows. (For Novices)

One Hour Rides -

A gentle sloping ride along the scenic Middle Fork of the Flathead River. (For Novices)
