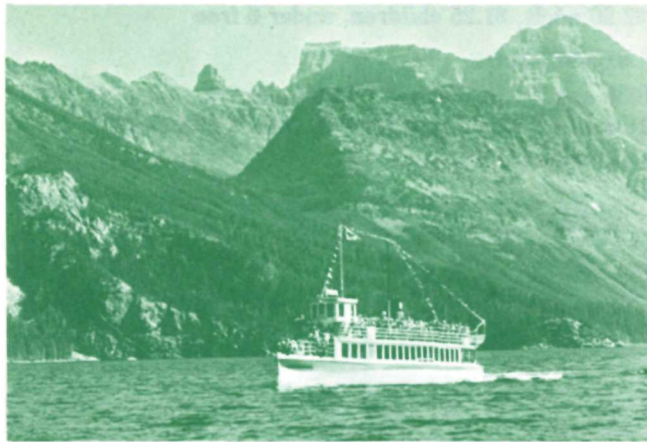


Waterton Lake

Crossing the Canadian border in the middle of a lake is just one of the new experiences awaiting you when you cruise Waterton Lake. Located almost equally in Glacier Park (U.S.) and Waterton Park (Canada), this major lake offers a spectacular view of mountain scenery and phenomena. Tours leave from Waterton Town Site at the north end of the lake and travel south to Goat Haunt Dock. The 11 a.m. and 4 p.m. cruises pause 20 minutes so passengers can tour the Visitor Center which commemorates the establishment of the Waterton-Glacier International Peace Park. Waterton Town Site is in an area having strong prevailing winds. The Goat Haunt area is more sheltered and an ideal location to picnic, hike or relax before catching a later return cruise. The "International" operates in all weather and is heated for passenger comfort.

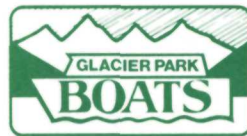
General information.

1. All times shown are Mountain Daylight Time.
2. *Indicates cruise accompanied by Ranger Naturalist. All other cruises have commentary by experienced boat captains.
3. Children under 6 free.
4. Scheduled cruises may be cancelled at captain's discretion when passenger safety is a consideration or when less than 4 adult fares are present.
5. All launches inspected and rates approved by the National Park Service and/or Parks Canada.

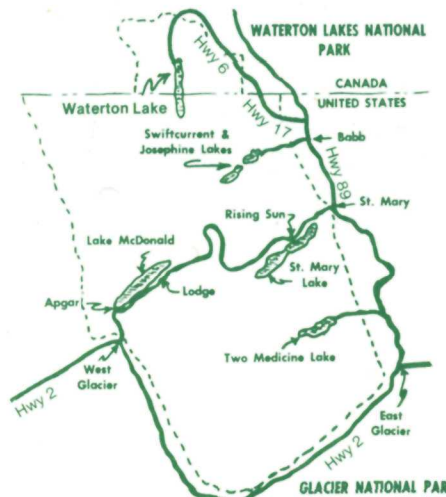
Boat rental rates.

1. Rowboat (without motor—\$2.50 per hour; \$12.50 per 10-hour day. (Two Medicine, Swiftcurrent, McDonald Lodge, Apgar Boat Dock.)
2. Boat with 5½ H.P. motor. \$4.50 per hour; \$22.50 per 10-hour day. (Two Medicine, McDonald Lodge, Apgar Boat Dock.)
3. Canoes—\$3.00 per hour; \$12.50 per 10-hour day. (Swiftcurrent, Two Medicine, Apgar Boat Dock.)

No fishing license is required and the fisherman can expect to catch Kokanee Salmon, Dolly Varden, Mackinaw and Cutthroat Trout.

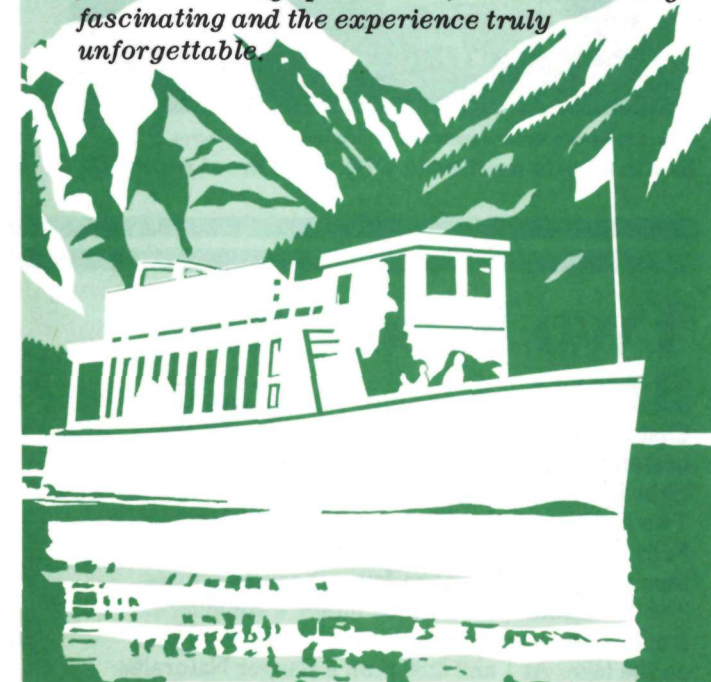

All cruises are narrated by the boat captain or a Ranger Naturalist so you can learn about the wilderness that surrounds you. And many cruises offer optional walks and hikes, where you may take an early cruise out and a later boat back. Bring your camera, too. You'll want to take these memories home.

As the launch quietly slips across the water, relax and let your mind go free. You'll find the scenery spectacular, the commentary fascinating and the experience truly unforgettable.



Lake McDonald area

The Lake McDonald Lodge, located along the Going-to-the-Sun Road at the north end of the lake, is where all cruises on Lake McDonald depart. The tour on this serene lake offers views of the Park not visible from the roadway. The popular evening cruise provides a slightly longer tour to allow the passengers an opportunity to view the lengthening shadows of sunset over the lake.

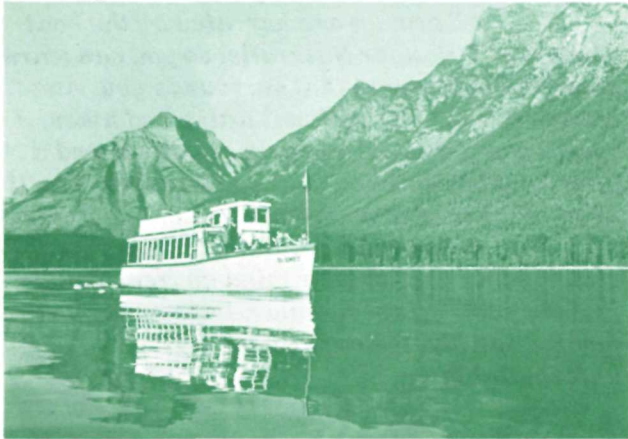

St. Mary Lake area

"Six miles from the St. Mary Entrance Station and Visitor Center along the Going-to-the-Sun Road is the Rising Sun Area where the boat tours of St. Mary Lake depart." You'll see Sexton Glacier, numerous waterfalls, rugged cliffs, and primitive forests — in short, some of the finest scenery the park has to offer. The four daytime cruises offer narration by a Ranger Naturalist, who also conducts optional 2-hour hikes to St. Mary Falls on the 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. cruises. A memorable Sunset Cruise is scheduled daily at 7:30 p.m. All but Sunset Cruise passengers may disembark and take a 15-minute walk to Baring Falls.

Many Glacier area

The Many Glacier area of the park offers you a look at one of nature's most awe-inspiring sights, some of the last remaining Ice Age glaciers. Departure is from Many Glacier Hotel, cruising across Swiftcurrent Lake. After a short walk (.2 mile), you'll board another launch to cross Lake Josephine. This is an unforgettable cruise with picnicking and hiking available—there's even a shelter at the head of Lake Josephine. If you enjoy hiking, take the 9:00 a.m. cruise with a Ranger Naturalist to guide you on the 1.8 mile walk to Grinnell Lake. Or if you want the memorable experience of actually standing on a glacier, don't miss the special 8:30 a.m. cruise for hikers going to Grinnell Glacier. It's an all-day hike, but the boat ride reduces the total walking distance from Many Glacier Hotel by about one half. Grinnell Glacier hikers may also leave hotel at 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. and return on last afternoon cruise.

Two Medicine area

Take the time to drive north from East Glacier to Two Medicine Lake. It's off the beaten trail and you'll find the alpine area exactly right for a picnic or hike with good fishing. Upper Two Medicine Lake, No-name Lake and Twin Falls are yours to explore or fish during the day, then return on any of the four scheduled cruises. The 45-minute cruise can be either a stepping stone to the back country or a relaxing interlude on the lake. At 1 and 2:30 p.m. a Ranger Naturalist

will conduct an optional one-hour (.9 mile) nature walk to Twin Falls. The view is worth the walk!
