

Wildlife may not know better—but YOU do! Give them room: Stay away 25 yards!

Moose are the largest member of the deer family—they can be 6–7 feet (~2 m) tall at the shoulder. The subspecies found in Glacier National Park can weigh up to about 800 pounds (363 kg). Moose can eat over 70 pounds (32 kg) of plant material each day in summer and over 30 pounds (14 kg) in winter. They can dive up to 20 feet (6 m) underwater to feed and can remain submerged for 30 seconds. Moose can kick in all directions with their front legs.

When closely approached or fed, moose may become aggressive. This is dangerous for people and moose and can cause the moose to be lethally removed from the population.
