HELPFUL HINTS FOR ENJOYING GLEN CANYON & LAKE POWELL



Visitor Services

Complete visitor services including lodging, restaurants, auto service, boat service, gift shops and RV campgrounds are available at Wahweap and Bullfrog Marinas. Halls Crossing, Hite and Dangling Rope offer partial services. Ourmently, there are no services on the San Juan arm of the lake. ARA Leisure Services offers river trips, boat tours and boat rentals, call 800-528-6154 for more information.

The town of Page, AZ, approximately 8 miles from the Wahweap Marina, has lodging, restaurants, auto and boat service centers, various shops, a hospital and an airport. Fewer services exist near other marinas.

Ferry service between Bullfrog and Halls Crossing operates on a regular basis throughout the year. For more information, call: 800-528-6154.

Camping

National Park Service developed campgrounds are located at Wahweap, Lees Ferry, Bullfrog and Halls Crossing. No hook-ups. No reservations. \$6 per site (limit 9 people). Self registration. Group campsite at Wahweap for organized groups only, call: 602-645-8883.

Primitive campgrounds are located at Lone Rock (near Wahweap), Warm Creek, Bullfrog Bay, Farley, Stanton and White Canyons and at Hite Marina. No water. Pit toilets. No fee.

Campgrounds with full utility hook-ups are provided by ARA Leisure Services at Wahweap, Bullfrog and Halls Crossing. Groceries, camper supplies, coin operated laundry and showers (open to public). Reservations and fee information call: 800-528-6154 (in Phoenix only: 278-8888).

Lakeshore/boat camping is permitted except at Rainbow Bridge National Monument. 14 day limit. Carry out ALL waste and litter.

All camping facilities remain open year round.

Boating

Private boats, rental boats (houseboats and powerboats) and tour boats are found on Lake Powell. Boat traffic may be heavy at times. Please learn and observe ALL water safety rules and regulations. Launch facilities, water, pump-outs and fuel available at Wahweap, Bullfrog, Halls Crossing, and Dangling Rope (no launch).

Hiking

Numerous opportunities for hiking exist within the Glen Canyon National Recreation Area and surrounding areas, however, maintained trails are few. Some areas may be accessible only from the lake or 4-wheel drive roads. Fishing

Bank fishing on Lake Powell as well as on the Colorado River below Glen Canyon Cam is limited. State fishing licenses are required. (NOTE: Lake Powell is in both Arizona and Utah). Licenses may be purchased at marina stores — persons under 14 years may fish without license.

Access to the Colorado River is at Lees Ferry off Hwy. 89A. No live bait, flies and lures CNLY. Effective 1-1-90 at Lees Ferry, possession limit 2 trout - only one over 22". Trout between 16" and 22" may NOT be possessed. Other specific regulations exist - see local bulletin boards.

The National Park Service offers a wide variety of activities throughout the area. Visitor centers at Wahweap (Carl Hayden Visitor Center at the Glen Canyon Dam), Bullfrog and Halls Crossing offer exhibits, displays and Natural History Association book and map sales.

Formal evening programs featuring various topics of interest are given from Memorial Day through Labor Day at Wahweap, Bullfrog, Halls Crossing and Lees Ferry.
