YOUR VACATION HEADQUARTERS

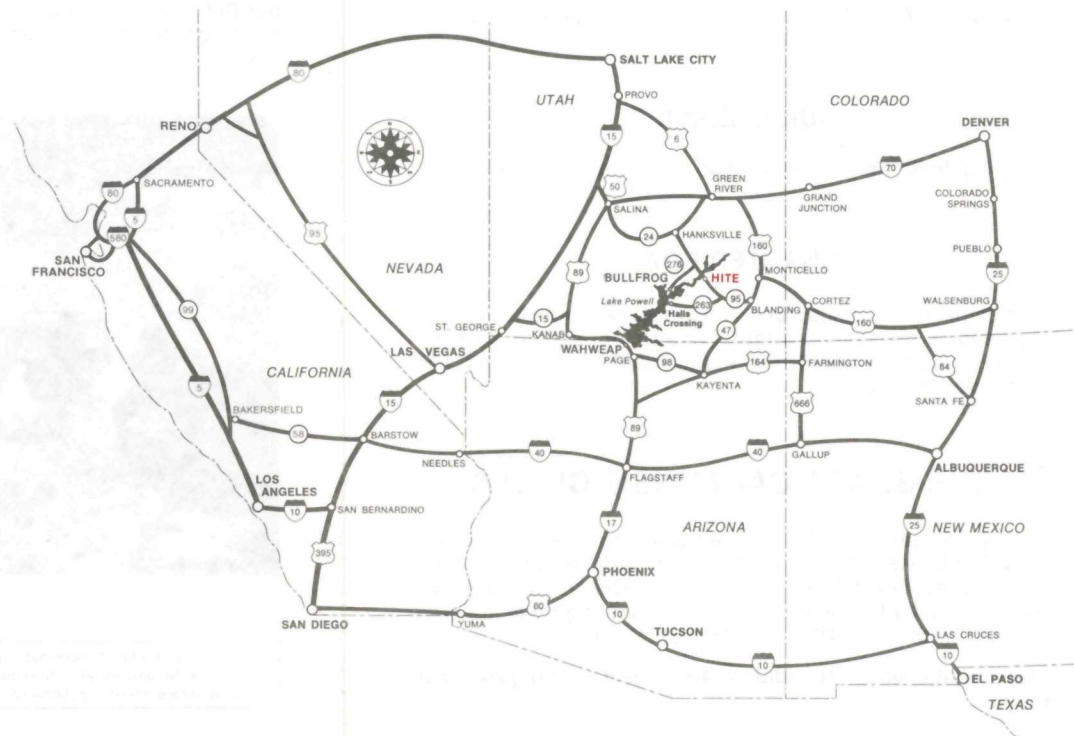
Hite can be more than your headquarters for water sports. Make us your home base for one-day trips into some of America's most scenic grandeur. Hite topography and climate are "high desert." Only 32 miles away, however, in the Henry Mountains, at 10,500 feet, is government maintained and pine-dotted Starr Springs picnic grounds. Foothills of the Henrys begin virtually at our doorstep, and contain miles of excitement for four-wheel driving, many types of wild game and one of the last wild buffalo herds in America. WATER SKIERS DELIGHT

Lake Powell, with its hundreds of quiet bays, is rapidly becoming a paradise for water skiers. A summer vacation at Hite offers a lot of sunlight, warm water temperatures and the mild to cool evenings of high desert country.



NPS CAMPGROUND AND LAUNCH RAMP

The National Park Service provides a primitive campground and launch area for small boats at Hite. No utilities, except centrally-located water and flush toilets are available in the campground area. Occupancy is on a first come, first serve basis. Near the marina, a sewage pumpout and dump station is available.

VISIT OUR MARINA & GROCERY

Hite Marina offers two locations where supplies can be purchased — dock-side at the marina, and a grocery mid-way between the marina and Highway 95, near the Park Service primitive campground and launch area. Each facility stocks a supply of grocery staples, sundries, ice, fishing licenses, bait and tackle, film, magazines, souvenirs, etc. Also available — a friendly staff with free advice on where to go, what to see and where the fish are biting.

NEW SERVICE STATION

Adjoining the grocery (and a boat repair shop and dry storage area) is a service station, with facilities for fuel and minor repairs.

SEASONAL AND GROUP DISCOUNT AND TRAVEL AGENT POLICIES

Hite Marina pays the customary 10 per cent commission to authorized travel agents on boat tours and off-season rentals. Travel agents and tour operators are entitled to either group rate or commission.

GROUP DISCOUNTS — 15 or more people: 20% on boat tours of half day or longer (50¢ each on shorter tours).

SEASONAL DISCOUNTS — Nov.1-March 15 : 10% on boat tours and 20% on boat rentals.



ABOUT OUR POLICIES

We are authorized to serve the public by the National Park Service. Other regulatory agencies include the U.S. Coast Guard, state recreation and game and fish departments and Interstate Commerce Commission. Hite Marina reserves the right to change equipment or cancel any trip at any time for any reason (in our best judgment concerning weather, safety, etc.). If a trip is cancelled and alternate arrangements not satisfactory, fares or deposits will be refunded. We also reserve the right to refuse use of equipment, facilities, etc., if the renter or customer in our judgment is ill or otherwise in a situation which might affect his own or the safety of others. We also reserve the right to call in rented boats improperly or unsafely handled.

TELEPHONES AND COMMUNICATIONS

A new aid — toll-free WATS telephone lines into Bullfrog Resort and Marina — is scheduled to be available approximately March 1, 1978. See this brochure cover for these numbers, a valuable help in making reservations for Hite through Bullfrog. Hite is not serviced with telephone equipment. We do have marine radio contact with Bullfrog and Hall's Crossing. This facility can be used by boats near Hite equipped with radio, or for emergency visitor needs.

YOU'LL LIKE OUR WEATHER

At 3700' elevation our climate is relatively mild, yet seasons are discernable. Spring brings varied winds and boaters are advised to "hole up" if breezes turn gusty in mid-lake. Water is usually cool to cold through May due to Colorado and Utah mountain runoff. Camping and hiking is excellent. Plants spring to life. Summer temperatures rarely reach 100. Water warms for swimming and skiing. Low humidity means comfortable evenings. Afternoon squalls are common in mid-summer. Autumn is the favorite of many familiar with Colorado plateau climate. Sun's position creates rock shadings to delight photographers. Sunsets are "picturebook". Lake cruises are delightful. Winters are relatively mild, nights are crisp and cool. Snow is rare.

HITE MARINA'S COLORFUL HISTORY

Hite Marina is the beginning of boating activity at the upper end of Lake Powell and first egress for vacationers who "run" the Colorado River from Moab or Green River to Cataract Canyon. The area as a crossing has a place in Utah's early history. In 1883, a prospector and fugitive from justice named Cass Hite arrived at the Colorado near Trachyte Creek, several miles southwest of present Hite Marina. There he developed a farm and ferry service and named his desert eden "Ticaboo", a Palute word meaning "friendly." In contrast, among the infrequent travelers who used his ferry he acquired a reputation as a cantankerous hermit.

Geologically interesting deposits in the Hite area include Cutler, Moenkopi, Chinle, Wingate, Kayenta, Navajo, Rico and Hermosa. Displayed in soaring cliffs in the up-lake main channel and canyons, and down-lake against the 10,000-foot peaks of the Henry Mountains, these colorful formations alone make a boating trip from Hite Marina a memorable event.

Houseboat Check-In and Check-Out — Check-out after 2:00 p.m. when boat is ready. Check-in no later than 9:00 a.m. morning of last day. Boats may be checked out earlier than specified if clean and ready.

General Features — Railed walkway, range and oven, refrigerator, ice chest, cabin heater, 12-volt light system, shower, monomatic toilet, bunk beds, drapes, 8-track tape deck, charcoal grill.

Operation — Operator is checked out in all procedures at marina. No special skills needed, only respect for size of craft, its engines and basic boating rules and courtesies.

Fuel — Fuel tanks are filled during check-out and re-filled at check-in at customer's expense. Propane gas is supplied.

Water — Approximately three-day supply on board; also available at Rainbow and other marinas.

Toilets — Each Lake Powell Marina has pumpout facilities.

Maps — Available at marina stores. A real help to first-time Lake Powell visitors.

What To Bring — Bedding and linens. We suggest a flashlight, shovel, any on-shore camping equipment desired. You may want to bring paper plates, cups, charcoal, dishcloths and towels.

We Supply — Cooking utensils, portable grill, silverware, plates and cups, garbage can and liners, bucket, mop, dust pan and broom, pillows, paper towels and toilet tissue.

Houseboat instruction book will be sent upon deposit receipt.

HOUSEBOAT & POWERBOAT SAFETY

All boats contain fire extinguishers, life preservers, anchor, sound device, oars (powerboats) and night light as required by the Coast Guard.

Powerboat Check-In and Check-Out — An official rental day is eight hours (unless rented with a houseboat). Check-outs begin at 7 a.m. in summer, 8 a.m. in winter. Check-in is 5 p.m. Overnight rental — 5 p.m.-7 a.m. — is at full-day rate (unless combined with full-day rental; half-day rate then applies).

HOUSEBOAT AND POWERBOAT CONDITIONS

Required deposits are damage deposits, refunded when boat is returned in same condition as check-out. Deposits are refundable only if cancelled by written notice 30 days in advance. Full rental fee plus 4% state tax required before boat check-out. Houseboats may not be loaded until contract signed. No rebates for late arrivals or early returns. Fuel tanks are filled before check-out and upon check-in. Gas used is renter's expense. To hold a powerboat, deposit must be made by 8 a.m. Charges will be made for damaged boats. Rentals limited to adults (above 18).

BOAT DOCKING AND DRY STORAGE

Slips — Open, \$2.25 per foot per month. One month minimum. Power, if available, \$1 per night.

Docking (Overnight only) — Boats to 20', \$3.00; 21-30', \$4.00; 31'-40', \$6.00; 41' and up, \$8.00.

Mooring — \$1.50 per foot per month; one month minimum. Taxi service free within reason.

Dry Storage — \$.75 per foot of boat per month. Weekly rate one-third monthly (one week minimum).

Trailer Storage — For guests using marina facilities, \$10 per month. One month minimum.

Special Note — Yearly rate for above services is 11 times monthly rate if paid in advance. Not refundable. Customers must secure their own boats and provide their own lines. We are not responsible for damages to boats while moored, docked or in dry storage, except for our negligence.

BOAT SALES AND SERVICE

Our trained marine mechanics repair all types of boat motors, outboard and inboard, and we have a large supply of parts. We are an authorized dealer for Bertram, Boston Whaler, Mark Twain, Starfire, Steury, Boatel and Kayot boats, and for the following motors: Evenrude and Mercury outboards: O.M.C. and Mercruiser.



WATER SKIS AND BEDDING

To help you enjoy your vacation, our rental equipment includes:

- Water skis, safety belt and rope — \$10/day (\$50 deposit)
- Ski Instructor — \$11 per hour
- Bedroll, sheet, pillow, 2 towels and wash cloth — \$5 per trip



FISHING AT POWELL

Lake Powell is one of the most scenic and productive year-round fishing spots in America. During 1977 several Powell fish records were set. Top weights reported:

All except the lower few miles of Lake Powell is in Utah. One year resident and non-resident licenses to fish the Utah portion are available at Hite Marina. 1978 fees are:

Non-Resident — 1 day, \$2.00 5 day, \$7.50 per year, \$25.00
Resident — per year, \$8.00



BASS BOAT & PILOT

Fully-rigged 17-foot fishing boat. One to three people, \$165 per day, \$30 per hour.

GUIDE SERVICE

Guide for fishing parties: \$65 per day, \$11 per hour.

CHARTER BOAT

Twin-engine boat, guide, food and beverages provided, including sleeping bags on overnights. One to four people: \$235 per day. Overnight campout: \$50 extra. Additional persons, \$25 each, to boat limit.

OUR BOATS, CAPTAINS & GUIDES

Hite Marina has been serving the public on Lake Powell since 1965. Our boats are regularly inspected by the National Park Service under Coast Guard specifications. Our pilots and guides are licensed by the Coast Guard (our fishing guides are also licensed by the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources).

Prices, equipment and conditions are subject to change without notice.

Adults — \$5.00/hour Children under 12 — \$4.00/hour

If you do not bring your own boat to Hite, or rent one of ours, we recommend you explore exciting Lake Powell via our cruiser and guide. We'll recommend a scenic route or, chart your course and pace (our pilot will describe scenery and history).

Approximately 35 miles "down lake" is Good Hope Bay. Nearby is Ticaboo Canyon, grave site of Cass Hite, after which Hite Marina is named. (Read Hite's Colorful History).

RIVER RUNNER PICKUP

"UP stream" from Hite, Lake Powell zig zags 35 miles to the northeast before officially becoming, again, the Colorado River. From Dirty Devil Canyon near Hite, to Cataract Canyon, where Green River and Colorado River tour operators end their raft trips, is some of the most stunning scenery in Lake Powell Country (see photo below).

Hite, using a 35-passenger cruiser with restrooms and shaded top, operates a river-runner "pick up" service to Dark Canyon and Gypsum Canyon, for \$10 and \$12 per person, respectively. An advance deposit of \$100 and 10 passengers (minimum) are requirements.

While these trips are not operated on a scheduled basis, there is almost always room aboard for Hite visitors. The three-hour round trip to Dark Canyon is \$15 for adults, \$12 for children. The four-hour round trip to Gypsum Canyon is \$20 for adults, \$16 for children under 12 years. Check at Hite in person, or through our Bullfrog reservations office, if you are interested in these exciting trips offered, normally, May through September.
