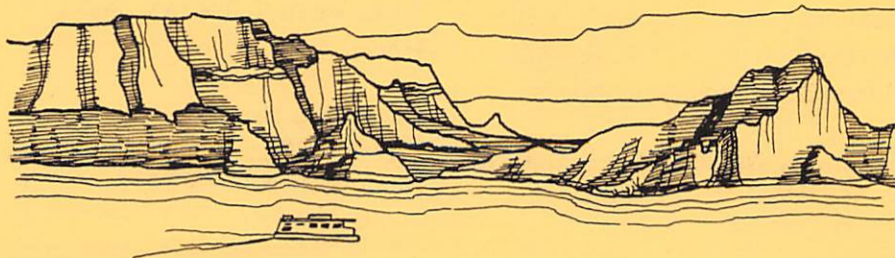

Visitor Services



Glen Canyon National Recreation Area and surrounding communities offer a variety of visitor services.

At Wahweap and Bullfrog, lodges, campgrounds for tents and recreational vehicles, restaurants, gift shops, marinas, and auto and boat services are available.

Halls Crossing, Hite, and Dangling Rope offer limited commercial services.

No services are available on the San Juan arm of the lake.

The town of Page, Arizona, approximately 8 miles (13 km) south of Wahweap, has overnight accommodations, restaurants, auto and boat service centers, retail shops, churches, a hospital, and an airport (602-645-2494).

CAMPING

A National Park Service campground is located at Lees Ferry. Sites are available on a first-come, first-served basis, are limited to 8 people per site, and provide no hook-ups. Camping fees are \$8.50 per site per night.

Primitive campgrounds are located at Lone Rock beach, Hite, the Bullfrog Bay area, and Farley and Stanton Canyons. No fees are charged, and water is not available.

Campgrounds with full utility hook-ups and those without are provided by a concessioner at Wahweap, Bullfrog, and Halls Crossing. Groceries, camping supplies, and coin-operated laundry and showers are available to the public (800-528-6154).

Lakeshore and boat camping are permitted throughout the recreation area except within developed areas and at Rainbow Bridge National Monument. Camping is limited to 14 consecutive days. Carry out all waste and litter.

RANGER PROGRAMS

National Park Service rangers offer evening programs and other activities throughout the recreation area, primarily from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Schedules of activities are posted on bulletin boards and are available at visitor centers and information stations.

Carl Hayden Visitor Center at Glen Canyon Dam and the visitor center at Bullfrog offer exhibits, displays, and interpretive sales outlets. Ranger stations at Halls Crossing, Hite, Lees Ferry, Dangling Rope, and Escalante offer limited services.

Tours of the Glen Canyon Dam are provided year-round on a self-guiding basis. Guided tours are offered by the Glen Canyon Natural History Association between April and October.

BOATING

Private boats, tour boats, and rental boats travel on Lake Powell. Boat traffic may be heavy, particularly between Memorial Day and Labor Day. Check state regulations for required boat equipment.

Please learn and observe all water safety rules and regulations. Complimentary boating information packets are available at park visitor centers.

Pump-out facilities, drinking water, and fuel are available at Wahweap, Bullfrog, Halls Crossing, Hite, and Dangling Rope. Launch ramps are also available, except at Dangling Rope. Boats may be rented from the park concessioner (800-528-6154).
