

Typical Habitat & When Found:

Scarlet Tanagers migrate from as far away as South America to nest at Great Falls Park in the spring. During fall migration, the male's bright red summer plumage changes to a yellow-green, similar to the females. Look high in the tree tops along Matildaville Trail and Old Carriage Road.

Bird song: A dry, clicking pit-ti-tuck call, with a raspy song similar to an American Robin.

Importance to the park: They eat flying insects and the larvae of wasps, and spread the seeds of fruits and berries.
