


# Animal Checklist Florida District



#### The Wild in Wildlife

This animal checklist includes amphibians, reptiles and mammals observed on the offshore islands, on the mainland and in the waters of Gulf Islands National Seashore. These habitats provide resting, feeding and nesting areas for a variety of wildlife. Federal laws protect all wild animals within the park. Please keep wildlife *wild* by not feeding or harassing them. Offering food is unhealthy for the animal and potentially unsafe for you. An unrestrained pet can harm wildlife and destroy their habitat, while possibly endangering the pet. By protecting the park's natural resources, the National Seashore will be preserved for all to enjoy.

## For Your Eyes Only


Although the numbers of certain animals such as raccoons are abundant, they are seldom seen during the day due to their nocturnal behavior. Sharp eyes and ears will help you discover wildlife. The best time to view amphibians is in the evening or following rain. Reptiles are easily

observed in the afternoons during the cool months, while mammals are best spotted in the early morning and evening hours. The National Seashore is listed as a National Watchable Wildlife Area. Please report new discoveries to park staff.


