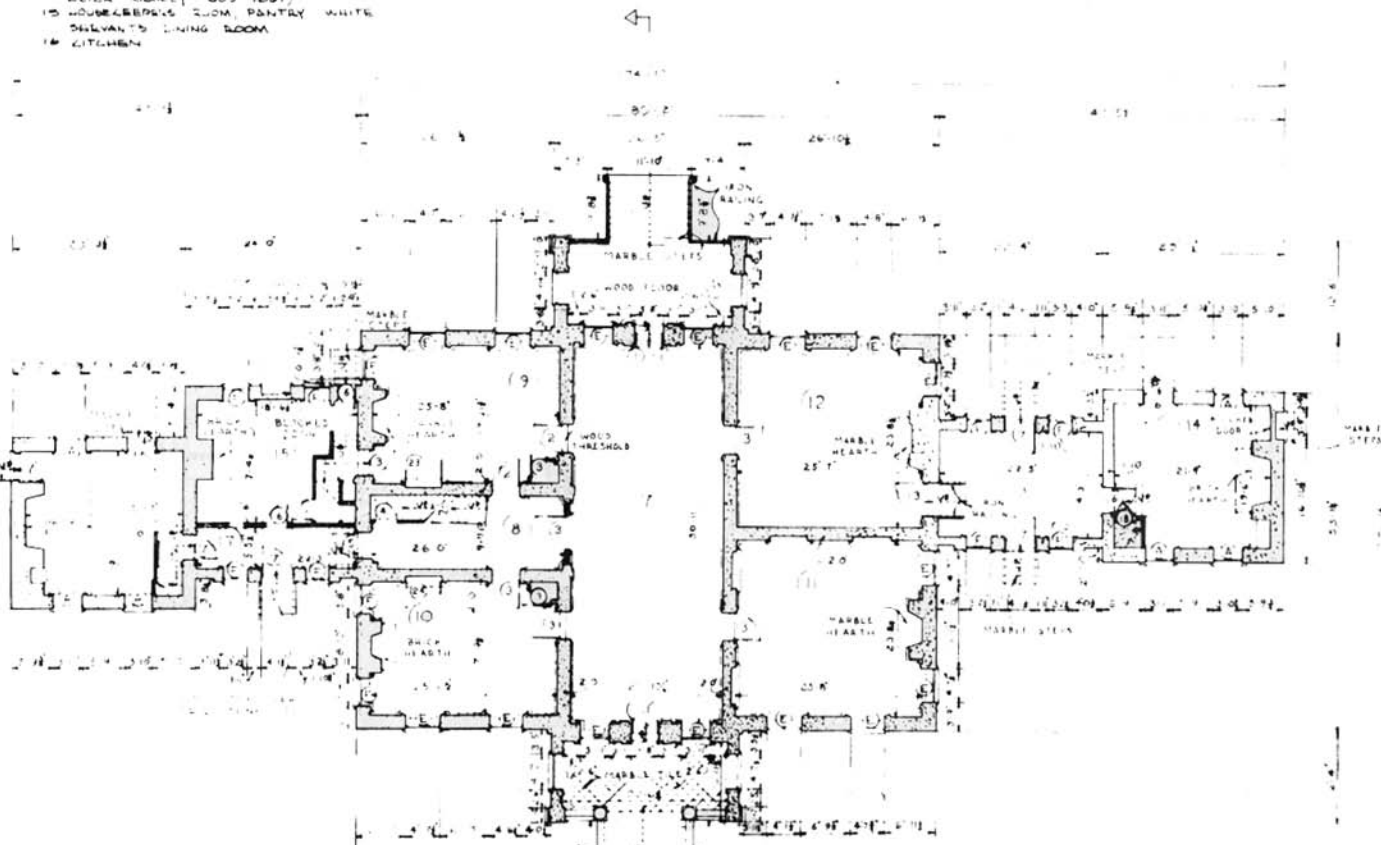


NOTE:

NOTE:

WOOD FLOOR IN ROOM 10 NUMBERS IN ROMAN NUMERALS TO SIMPLIFY INSTALLATION.
 OPENING BETWEEN ROOMS 7 & 8 CLOSED SOON AFTER HOUSE WAS COMPLETED.
 LEFT HYPHEN HAS BEEN EXTENSIVELY MODIFIED AT VARIOUS TIMES, PRINCIPALLY FROM 1819-1867 WHEN JOHN RIDGELY WAS OWNER (1790-1867).
 ROOM FINISHES ARE WOOD FLOOR, PLASTER WALLS AND CEILING.
