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HISTORY

Charlotte Lovejoy Wescott's father, Channing J. Lovejoy was the manager of the Volcano House from late 1923 until July 1927.

Channing Jameson Lovejoy was born in Ann Arbor, Michigan in 1877. Meta Carolyn Fiebig (Lovejoy) was born in Grand Rapids, Michigan in 1881. The couple moved to Victoria, British Columbia in 1910. Charlotte and her brothers were all born in Victoria, British Columbia where her father was employed at the Empress Hotel. Charlotte was born on January 10, 1916 and is the youngest of the three children.

In 1917 the family moved to Honolulu where he managed the Commercial Club. They sailed to Honolulu on the Steamship Niagara in June of 1917. Channing Lovejoy was the manager of the Volcano House from late 1923 until July 1927. Channing moved to Hawaii Island first, then Charlotte, her mother Meta "Pete" Lovejoy, and her two brothers Dick and Jack moved over in 1924 after school was out. Charlotte was eight years old. July of 1927, the family moved back to Honolulu for a year, then to San Diego, CA.
