On this farm Harry S Truman learned the values of hard work, common sense and family ties. The farm home is now a unit of the National Park Service.

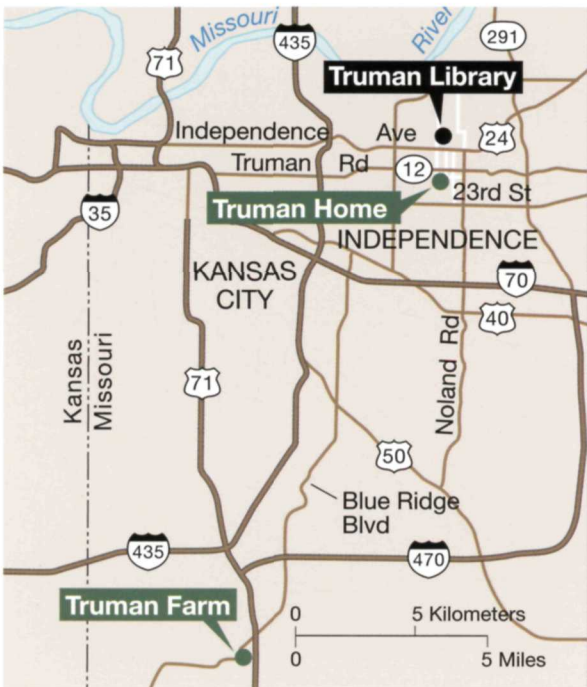

The farm home is located in Grandview, 19 miles south of the Truman home in Independence.

Directions:

From Independence take Truman Road west to I-435 South. Drive 10.6 miles, then merge onto US-71 south toward Grandview. Take the Blue Ridge Blvd. exit and turn right. The farm is located 0.6 miles on the left at 12301 Blue Ridge Blvd.

Truman Farm Home Tour Information:

The home is open by guided tours only. Tour tickets are sold on a first-come, first-served basis. Tour sizes are limited. Cost is \$4.00 per person. Children 15 years and under are free. All persons touring the home must have a ticket. Group reservations are available upon advanced request. Grounds remain open from dawn to dusk year round.
