Truman Farm Home

After graduating high school in 1901 Harry S Truman held several jobs in Kansas City. Within five years Harry and his family moved to Grandview to help run the family farm; he would spend the next 11 years of his life as a farmer. Those eleven years would help shape the man that would become the 33rd President of the United States.

Mr. Truman remarked years later,

"...Riding one of these plows all day, day after day, gives one time to think. I've settled all the ills of mankind in one way and another while riding along seeing that each animal pulled his part of the load."

From visitor center in Independence: Take
Truman Road West 4 miles to
I-435 South towards Wichita, KS.
After 10.6 miles take highway
71-south toward Grandview;
take Blue Ridge Blvd. exit and turn right. The farm is located
.6 miles on the left

From Kansas City and points west: Take I-70 east to I-435 south towards Wichita, KS; follow above directions
