Alice Paul dedicated her life to equal rights for women. She organized rallies, parades, demonstrations, and even hunger strikes to help women gain the right to vote. After the adoption of the 19th Amendment extended voting rights to women, Paul realized that the work of women's equality was not done. She later drafted the Equal Rights Amendment.
