Gerald Ford is the only park ranger who later became President of the United States. In 1936, he worked at Yellowstone National Park. He later remembered it as "one of the greatest summers" of his life. He often told stories about working on a bear feeding truck, something the National Park Service no longer does. As the 38th president, Gerald Ford added 18 park units to the National Park Service.
