1:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. Life on the Farm Peek into the corn crib, explore the woodpegged barn, watch the work horses and cherish the fragrant smells wafting from the wood cook stove in the farmhouse at the turn-of-the-century Chellberg farm. Park at the Bailly/Chellberg parking lot.

Friday, June 18




