



## DUNEWOOD CAMPGROUND INFORMATION

**Facilities:** 78 campsites: 53 conventional drive-in sites; 25 walk-in sites  
Restrooms and showers  
No electric hookups  
Accessible to visitors with mobility impairments  
No limit on recreational vehicle length

**Season:** April 1 to October 31

**Fees:** All sites are \$15.00 per night. Fees are reduced 50% for holders of Golden Age and Golden Access cards. No reservations are accepted.

### Attractions/

**Services:** Lake Michigan is located 1.5 miles north of the campground. Several beaches are within easy driving distance. A gas station and convenience store is located ¼ mile north of the campground at the intersection of U.S. 12 and Broadway. A South Shore Railroad station, with passenger service to Chicago and South Bend, is located on Broadway, ¼ mile north of the campground.

### Federal Law Authorizes the Following Passes:

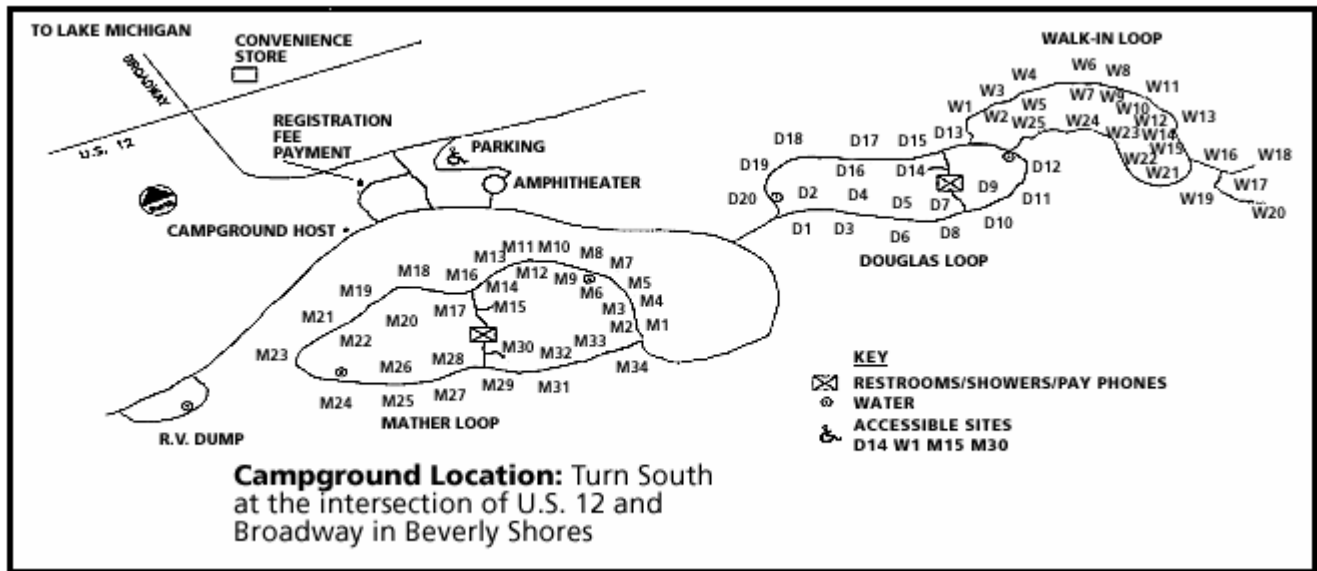
**National Parks Pass:** This \$50 annual pass allows entry to National Parks where an entrance fee is charged. However, it does not apply to camping or other fees. It is available at the Dorothy Buell Memorial Visitor Center, on the Web at [www.nps.gov](http://www.nps.gov), or by calling 1-888-GO-PARKS.

**Golden Eagle Hologram:** This \$15 annual upgrade to the National Parks Pass allows entry to other federal areas where an entrance fee is charge; however, it does not apply to camping or other user fees. Although it is not available at Indiana Dunes National Lakeshore, this upgrade is available at participating federal areas.

**Golden Age Passport:** This \$10 lifetime permit is for United States citizens 62 or older. It covers entrance fees and provides a 50% discount on some daily use fees, including camping. It is available at the visitor center.



**Golden Access Passport:** This lifetime passport is for persons who are blind or have permanent disabilities. It covers entrance fees and provides a 50% discount on daily recreation use fees, including camping. It is available at the visitor center.



## Registration/Camping Information

- Camping is on a first come/first serve basis.
- Once a site is selected, please register within one hour.
- Others will know that you have selected the site by seeing your tent/camper/camping equipment.
- Site renewal is by 10 a.m. Check out is noon.
- Registration receipts are displayed on the campsite marker post.
- Stays are limited to 14 days in a 30-day period.
- Quiet hours are 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Please be considerate of others.
- Site limits are:
  - 8 people per site
  - 2 vehicles (1 for walk-in sites)
  - 1 R.V. or camper or 2 tents (R.V. counts as a vehicle)
- Tents must be on a pad, vehicles/R.V. campers must remain completely on the pavement.
- Pets must be attended, caged or on a leash of a maximum length of 6 feet.
- Since exotic insect pests living in firewood kill native trees, don't bring firewood from ash trees to the park. Burn all firewood, take no firewood home.

## Prohibited Activities

- Possession/consumption of alcoholic beverages
- Driving over 15 MPH on campground roads
- Bicycles/vehicles off paved roads
- Wood gathering/cutting
- Campfires outside of provided grates
- Driving nails or hanging hot lanterns in trees
- Digging/leveling campsite
- Bathing/washing at water outlets
- Disturbing/hunting/capturing wildlife or plants
- Weapons/traps/fireworks
