A Junior Ranger is an important person who helps park rangers take care of our national parks.


One way you can help is by learning about this special place.

Voyageurs National Park is a beautiful place. Color this picture of the park.




Beaver Tools

2. What do you think a beaver would use its tail for?














Key: A B C D E F G H I J K L M N O P Q R S T U V W X Y Z




There are big fish, small fish, young fish and old fish in Voyageurs National Park.

How do we know?


Rangers count the rings on a fish fin. Each ring is 1 year.
