

Law Enforcement Park Ranger—enforce the laws in the park.

Biologist—study and protect animals, plants, and other wild things.

Archeologist—study and protect ancient ruins and artifacts.

Fire Fighter—help prevent and fight wildland fires.

Maintenance Worker—maintain and fix everything in the park.

Administration & Management—help manage the park.
